<u>AB 428:</u> CONFORMS NEVADA"S MEAT AND POULTRY INSPECTION LAW TO FEDERAL INSPECTION LAW. Hearing on this bill March 4, 1971: Mr. Getto stated that the Governor would go along with the Program, and it was getting late in the session and he would like to have some action on this bill.

AB 118: CHANGES COMPOSITION OF STATE DAIRY COMMISSION:

This bill was heard on February 18, 1971:


