After much discussion it was decided that Miss Hawkins and Mr. Gamble would go over $\underline{AB\ 224}$ and take out any funding and insert other suggestions made.

Chairman Swallow said that committee would now discuss AB 393 and AB 561, the bills relating to modifying provisions on teachers leaves.

After some discussion from all of the guests Chairman Swallow said he was going to say for shortening the discussion, that all here that had spoken had opposed <u>AB 561</u> and so let's take action on <u>AB 393</u> now.

Mrs. Frazzini moved that AB 561 be refered back to introducers.
