COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION - MEETING

APRIL 13, 1971 130

MEMBERS PRESENT: Swallow, Frazzini, Hawkins and Foote

MEMBERS ABSENT: Smalley, Wilson, White

GUESTS: Richard Morgan, State Board of Education

Chairman convened the meeting at 1:30 P.M. for the purpose of discussing the amendments attached to <u>AB 393</u> and <u>AB 225</u> and <u>SB 350</u>, a bill on conservation education.

The amendment to <u>AB 225</u> by the Senate is No. 3687 and reads "Amend Section 3, page 2, line 24 by deleting the period and inserting "except that any board of trustees of a school district may elect to keep school open on October 31 (Nevada Day) and observe such holidays with appropriate exercises."

Motion was made not to concur in the senate amendment to AB 225.

Motion seconded.

Motion carried.

A first conference committee was appointed by Chairman Swallow to confer with the Senate. The Committee appointed was Francis Hawkins, Mary Frazzini and Margie Foote.

Next was AB 393, which would modify provisions on teachers' leaves.

Motion was made to concur in Senate Amendment 4836 and put out on the floor.

Motion seconded.

Motion carried.

Chairman turned the meeting over to discussion of <u>SB 350</u> on conservation education.

Richard Morgan said he was told to suggest passage of this bill.

One member asked whater who was in back of it.

Mary Frazzini said that there were so many bills on conservation.

Vote was taken as to whether to do pass or not.

Two voted yes and two voted no.

<u>Chairman said he would get the opinion of the other members which he later did</u> as we were coming out of the elevator and they voted yes.

Meeting had just adjourned prior to this.
