SB 614 - Amends law relating to county aid to indigents.

Mr. Henry told the committee that Clark County felt that this was an important bill and should be acted favorabley upon by the committee. He stressed that the original law regarding county aid was passed in 1861 and should be updated. This bill would do the following things:

1. Establish criticia for eligibility.

2. Place a limit on the aid that can be given.

3. Allow the county to make exception in certain cases and use any money that they can find to care for these cases.

Supervisor Meder spoke for the County Commissioners Association saying that they supported the bill.

Assemblyman Lauri asked what what standards were used to determine eligibility.

Mr. Henry said that the county generally used the State Welfare standards.

Assemblyman Getto questioned the residency requirement.

Mr. Henry explained that this requirement is in the bill, however, because of recent court decisions it is not invoked.

Assemblyman Ronzone moved DO PASS. Assemblyman Dini seconded the motion. The motion carried.
