

Minutes of Meeting - HEALTH AND WELFARE COMMITTEE - 56th
ASSEMBLY SESSION - April 8, 1971

Meeting was convened by Chairman Wilson at 3:45 P.M.

S.B. 337: Makes Health Division of Department of Health,
Welfare, and Rehabilitation responsible for
licensing certain care facilities.

Earl Yamashita, Welfare Division, stated the Health Division
has been doing the licensing anyway so he just felt they
should transfer the bill.

Mrs. White made a motion for S.B. 337 a Do Pass; Swallow
seconded; motion carried unanimously.

S.B. 193: Licenses and regulates ambulance, air ambulance
and school bus personnel.

Mr. Valentine questioned this bill. The Committee heard
testimony on this bill yesterday. He felt this license may
be mixed up with the Motor Vehicles Department. He suggested
changing the word "license" to "certificate" so there would
be no mix up.

Other questions to this bill were discussed that had been
brought out in yesterday's meeting.

Mr. Glaser made a motion to Amend S.B. 193 and Do Pass;
Valentine seconded; motion carried unanimously.

S.B. 148: Authorizes establishment of community mental health
centers.

Pat Mikawa, Washoe County Advisory Board on Mental Health and
Mental Retardation, stated California has a bill like this
that passed in 1965. S.B. 148 is a model of that bill. The
Finance Committee has already approved the budget.

Valentine made a motion for S.B. 148 a Do Pass; Smalley seconded;
motion carried unanimously.

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S.B. 520: Proposes various amendments to Act Concerning
Cosmetology.

The Committee heard testimony on this bill at an earlier date.
Mr. Valentine discussed proposed amendments to this bill.

Mr. Valentine made a motion to Amend S.B. 520 and Do Pass;
Swallow seconded; motion carried unanimously.

A.B. 575: Allows only Nevada residents to be committed to
juvenile correctional institutions.

The Committee heard testimony on this bill at an earlier date.

Mr. Valentine made a motion to Indefinitely Postpone A.B. 575;
Poggione seconded; motion carried unanimously.

A.B. 360: Requires parents to submit status of immunization
certificates to public schools as requisite for
admission of children.

The Committee heard testimony on this bill at an earlier date.
There was a conflict between this bill and A.B. 713.

Mr. Valentine made a motion to Indefinitely Postpone A.B. 360;
Poggione seconded; motion carried unanimously.

S.B. 613: Provides for licensed physical therapy assistants.

Mr. Valentine made a motion to Indefinitely Postpone S.B. 613;
Homer seconded; motion carried with a vote of 6-2 with Poggione
and Wilson voting against.

A.B. 402: Requires revocation, suspension of state licenses
issued to businesses and occupations for violating
laws relating to equal enjoyment of places of public
accommodation; broadens definition of "public accom-
modation".

The Committee heard testimony on this bill at an earlier date.

Mr. Valentine made a motion to Indefinitely Postpone A.B. 402;
Poggione seconded; motion carried with a vote of 7-1 with
Wilson dissenting.

Meeting adjourned at 4:20 P.M.
