

ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY = 56TH SESSION, 1971

MEETING MARCH 4, 1971

The meeting began at 3:15 p.m. Present: Miss Foote, Messrs. Fry, Lowman, Torvinen, Dreyer, Olsen and May. Absent: Messrs. Kean and McKissick.

Mr. Torvinen moved the committee concur in the Senate amendments to AB 47. Seconded by Mr. Dreyer. Carried.

Mr. Lowman moved "Do Pass as Amended" AB 165. Mr. Fry stated there should be a further amendment including public parks, recreation areas and historic monuments.

Mr. Amended Mr. Lowman's motion to provide that the amendments to AB 165 be drafted and brought back for the committee's consideration. Seconded by Mr. Dreyer. Carried.

Mr. Torvinen moved that AB 69 be indefinitely postponed. Seconded by Mr. Lowman. Carried.

Mr. Fry moved that AB 149 be indefinitely postponed. Seconded by Mr. Torvinen. Carried.

Mr. Fry distributed copies of proposed amendments to AB 373, AB 374, and AB 375, and noted the amendments included charitable projects but not public projects, and said he thought the committee wanted to include both.

Mr. Fry moved that AB 374 be indefinitely postponed. Seconded by Mr. Lowman. Carried.

Mr. Fry moved that AB 375 be indefinitely postponed. Seconded by Mr. Lowman. Carried.

Mr. Torvinen moved that AB 373 be amended to include "public projects", and the committee recommend "Do Pass as Amended". Seconded by Mr. May. Carried.

Miss Foote moved that AB 163 be indefinitely postponed. Seconded by Mr. Lowman. Carried, with Mr. May voting "No."

Mr. Torvinen moved that AB 242 be amended to remove "or his agent or representative" and leave in "officer of the corporation", and the committee recommend "Do Pass as Amended". Seconded by Mr. Lowman. Carried.

Mr. Olsen moved "Do Pass" AB 255. Seconded by Mr. May. Carried.

Mr. Torvinen requested that Mr. Guinan examine and study AB 179 to resolve the conflict in accounting procedures.

Mr. Fry moved that AB 315 be indefinitely postponed. Seconded by Mr. Olsen. Carried.

Mr. Fry asked for committee introduction on three bills:

(1) Defines police officer and public employee for purposes of retirement.

Mr. Torvinen moved the committee introduce the bill. Seconded by Mr. Fry. Carried.

(2) Regarding the state athletic commission. The committee decided it is appropriate for the Commerce Committee's introduction.

(3) Increases the number of crimes on interception of communications.

Mr. Torvinen moved the committee introduce the bill. Seconded by Mr. Fry. The motion lost.

Mr. Fry appointed a subcommittee of Messrs. Lowman, Torvinen and Kean to consider the amendments to AB 107 and present their findings to the committee.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:15 p.m.
