

MINUTES OF MEETING - COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATIVE FUNCTIONS - 56TH
ASSEMBLY SESSION

February 4, 1971

Chariman Lauri convened meeting at 10:35.

Mr. Lauri stated that at the last meeting with the Senate it was agreed to go ahead with tile. That will not be satisfactory because tile (from floor to ceiling) for room 328 alone would cost \$490 and it may be necessary to carpet also; whereas, if the floors were carpeted, wall and ceiling tile probably would not be needed.

Mr. Lauri outlined two schemes received from Mr. Hancock of the Planning Board. Scheme A is carpet and wall treatment. Scheme B is wall treatment only.

Mr. Lauri showed the committee a letter from Mr. Hancock with carpet quotations of \$10.20 per square yard and \$10.50 per square yard installed. Both quotations were from retail furniture outlets.

The committee questioned whether these figures could not be improved by going to professional floor covering firms rather than getting estimates from retail furniture outlets.

Mr. Roy Young moved that the committee instruct Mr. Hancock to investigate and get estimates from three commercial carpeting firms for Assembly rooms 230 and 328 and Senate Room 327 and 345, and to report to the Committee Chairman the results.

Motion seconded by Mr. Schofield and unanimously carried.
