

MINUTES OF MEETING - COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATIVE FUNCTIONS
56TH ASSEMBLY SESSION

MARCH 9, 1971

PRESENT: N. Lauri, Chairman, R. Young, D. Mello, W. Wilson,
N. Glaser, J. Schofield and R. Torvinen, and
G. Lingenfelter (Guest)

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, N. Lauri, at
10:30 a.m., in the Assembly Lounge.

Mr. Lingenfelter requested that the Committee take action on
the following resolution:

A.G.R. 11 Directs Legislative Commission to make study of
Laws relating to Architecture, Construction
Industry and Engineering.

Mr. Lingenfelter said that there were numerous "little bills"
up for consideration affecting these industries. He said that
most of the representatives from these various construction
industries were agreeable - that if a good study committee
could be appointed by the Legislature to work with them during
the coming year - they would forego recommending further legis-
lation to solve their individual problems.

Mr. Lauri stated that the Legislative Commission assigns the
priority on these studies - the Legislative Functions Committee
has the authority to pass or not pass out these various
recommendations for studies. Number of studies made per year,
costs of same and manner in which conducted were reviewed by
the committee members.

Motion was made by D. Mello, seconded by J. Schofield for a
"do pass" on A.G. R. 11. Motion carried.

A. B. 599 Directs Governor to proclaim Nevada Mineral
Industry Week.

After a short discussion regarding the costs of these bills for
"National _____ Weeks;" motion was made by Schofield, seconded
by W. Wilson for a "Do Pass" on this bill. Motion carried.
