MINUTES OF TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE MEETING - 56TH NEVADA ASSEMBLY SESSION - MARCH 9, 1971

Present: Lowman, F. Young, Kean, Howard, Ashworth,

Prince and Valentine

Also Present: Grant Davis, Counsel

Chairman Lowman convened the meeting of the Transportation Committee with representatives of various companies and organizations present to testify on bills A.B. 592, 604, 605, 606, 611 and 616 at 10:30 a.m. in Room 240.

A.B. 605 - Permits impounding of motor vehicle driven by unauthorized person.

Bill Fitzpatrick, Safety Traffic Division, said that the Department endorses this bill.

Young then suggested that a resolution may be made to prevent those people with suspended licenses to use them. He suggested writing letters to all of the Justices of the Peace and to the law enforcement agency in the area with instructions to bick up the vehicle.

Valentine advised that the legal owner would then be required to go into the district court to defend himself.

Davis advised that it is not aimed at the legal owner. He felt that family members who can show proof that they need the impounded car can get it out if an amendment so saying was added. The lein law was also discussed.

Howard said that he would like this in the bill.

Valentine said that it would hurt people who rent the cars and the legal owner.

Daryl Capurro, advised that the Franchised Automobile Dealers have reservations about this bill. He stated that the point was not to get to the legal owner but that this bill puts the legal owner in jeopardy. He felt that we should keep the driver with a suspended license off the highway without jeopardizing the lein holder.

Young also advised that a person should be able to sell his car if he so wanted to do so after it was impounded.

Capurro advised that the car could not be sold unless a person could prove irreparable damage.

Brian Firth, Carson City, was against the bill. He said a person would not be using his property if the car is impounded. He suggested that even if an individual owned the highway system and

someone drove on it, it is not a crime, it is a trespass. The highway is a monopoly protected by the state. It is a necessity that the highway system has the right to serve whomever it chooses. It is a violation of any due process. It is destroying life, liberty and property.

A.B. 611 - Provides vehicle registration fee exemptions for Indian tribes.

Assemblyman Eileen Brookman, Clark County District 4, introduced Ross Morris, Executive Director of the Indian Affairs Commission.

Brookman stated the reason for the bill. She said that quite a few tribes that are qualified and organized under municipal laws should get their car licenses free.

Morris stated that these vehicles were used mostly on the reservations by the tribal groups. This would involve 22 vehicles. The title would be in the name of the tribal groups. He advised that each tribal group buys its own insurance coverage. The use of the vehicle has to be approved by the Tribal Council itself. They have an accounting procedure also. It is owned by the governing body. The fiscal note estimates the first year cost would be \$1,500 and then continue at \$2,000.

Brookman urged a do pass on this bill.

Richard Herz, Chief, Registration Division, asked if it would fall under the exempt license fee, \$2.50, or come in on a strict license fee, \$5.50. Valentine advised it would be \$ .50.

A.B. 285 - Prescribes proper equipment and operation of motorcycles and establishes motorcycle driver's license procedure.

Valentine advised that a group of cycle dealers in Sparks wants the age limit lowered to 14 for a learner's permit and 14 1/2 for a license. Also, to have a training program for motorcycles. Such a bill is in the Education Committee at the present time.

A discussion then took place on the age limitations of this bill.

Lee Rose, Las Vegas, submitted statistics of accidents and other material (see <u>attached</u>). He suggested making it mandatory to have headlights on at all times, day and night, for the motorcycles because they are hard to see when someone is driving a car.

Valentine suggested the age of 14 provided the boy was enrolled in a school approved by the Department of Education.

Ashworth moved to allow a learner's permit at 14 years of age for driving off the highway.

Howard agreed on the learner's permit with the Department

of Education's approval.

Valentine was requested by the Chairman to work with Assemblyman Dini regarding the bill presently in the Education Committee and this bill to get a compatible amendment. Members agreed to this.

A.B. 606 - Prohibits alteration, defacement, destruction of motor numbers.

John Ciardella, advised that the Department of Motor Vehicles supports this bill.

A short discussion then resulted.

Firth felt that some words had been left out. In sub-section 1 after person "or then the legal owner", otherwise, he can do what he wants to do with the property.

A.B. 616 - Regulates U-turns on highways.

James Lambert, Superintendent, Law Enforcement Division, advised that the Nevada Highway Patrol supports the bill.

Kean asked about establishing rates for tow operators.

Lambert advised that there was legislation to straighten this matter out.

F. Young took over in the absence of Chairman Lowman who went to testify before the Commerce Committee.

Kean moved a do pass with an amendment on a bill for introduction spelling out vehicles that are not taxed. He questioned the description in Section 5 of truck.

Valentine suggested a re-draft of the bill and then bring it back.

Capurro said in Chapter 482 there is a definition of motor trucks. He suggested striking the definition of truck or motor truck itself.

Young saw a problem with the definition of trailers in Section 8.

Capurro said there is a definition in Chapter 484.

Young brought up another Department of Motor Vehicle bill draft which increases liability insurance for short-term vehicles for accidents.

Howard moved to hold up this bill for a while, Valentine seconded it and the committee does not want to introduce it at this time.

A.B. 592 - Revises definitions relating to driving of motor vehicles and safety responsibility.

Assemblyman Woodrow Wilson explained that this bill he thought was offered by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Fitzpatrick advised that there was no testimony from the Department on this bill. He said he didn't know where the bill came from.

Capurro was against this bill.

Lambert did not know where the bill came from.

Richard Bordalin, Deputy Attorney General, Council for the Department of Motor Vehicles, felt there was a possibility that this could have gotten mixed up. It probably should have been discarded.

Freddie Little, Department of Motor Vehicles, felt that this bill should be held for further checking.

A.B. 604 - Changes registration period for travel trailer.

Herz advised that the Assessors are against it and so they were too.

The hearing was adjourned at 11:58 a.m.

On A.B. 604, Ashworth moved to indefinitely postpone, Valentine seconded, and it was unanimously agreed.

On A.B. 605, Kean moved to indefinitely postpone, Valentine seconded, and it was unanimously agreed.

Chairman Lowman returned at this point.

On A.B. 606, Kean moved "do pass", Valentine seconded, and it was unanimously passed.

On A.B. 611 - a discussion took place on this bill. It was then moved, seconded, and unanimously agreed to indefinitely postpone.

On A.B. 616, Valentine moved "do pass", Kean seconded, and it was unanimously passed.

On A.B. 592, Valentine moved to indefinitely postpone, Ashworth seconded, and it was unanimously agreed.

Lowman advised that Assemblyman Swallow on A.B. 647 did not feel it was a good bill. Kean moved to indefinitely postpone, Valentine seconded, and it was unanimously agreed.

On A.B. 648, Valentine moved to indefinitely postpone, Young seconded, and it was unanimously agreed.

Lowman then read a letter from Andy Maris asking for a bill

allowing him one taxicab in Las Vegas. Ashworth did not feel anything should be done with it, Valentine seconded, and it was unanimously agreed.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:05 p.m.



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On 1-14-71 at approximately 8:55 A.M., Unit AT2, Deputy ROBERT SJOGREN #686, responded to the scene of a motor vehicle roadway accident located at the intersection of Delmar Avenue and Meteoro Street, Las Vegas, Nevada.

Investigation at the scene disclosed that Vehicle #1, while eastbound on Delmar Avenue, struck Vehicle #2 as it was north-bound on Meteoro Street, attempting to execute a left turn onro the westbound lane of Delmar Avenue.

Initial contact occurred 16' north of the south curb line of Delmar Avenue and 5'10" east of the west curb line of Meteoro Street. Vehicles #1 and #2 left no locked skidmarks upon the roadway prior to or following the collision.

Damage to Vehicles #1 and #2 was very minor, however the driver of Vehicle #1 sustained a fractured right leg and was taken to Sunrise Hospital Emergency Room via Mercy Ambulance for medical attention.

The direct cause of the accident was attributed to Vehicle #2's failure to yield right of way after a stop. The driver of Vehicle #2 was cited accordingly.

The father of the driver of Vehicle #1 took possession of Vehicle #1, that being a 1971 Honda Motorcycle.

- Q. Weah. And it's, it's just a driveway coming out of that trailer park?
- A. Yeah, it's right again Evans Aven, Avenue.
- Q. Um-hum. Okay what's the mans name of this trailer park?
- A. Rose's Red Top Trailer Park.
- Q. Roses Red Top. Okay a now approximately how fast were you going?

- A. Well that would be hard to say, maybe fifteen, twenty at the most.
- Q. Um, now at the a place of the accident what was the location of your car on the highway, where wxactly were you when you were involved in the accident?
- A. I was in the west lane of the south highway....ah south side of the road.
- Q. Then you a, how far were you out onto a Las Vegas Boulevard?
- A. Well halfway across the south lane. The lane going north.
- Q. Youwere halfway across the southbound lanes?
- A. Northbound.
- Q. Northbound lanes?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Had you already crossed the southbound lanes?
- A. No, no y.....
- Q. You were just crossing the northbound lanes to get to the southbound lanes?
- A. Right.
- Q. Okay and you were about halfway across those lanes then huh?
- A. Yes.
- Q. And a, when did you no...first notice the other car?
- A. Well this was a motorcycle.
- Q. Yeah...
- A. Well that's, when I hit it was the first E knew of it.

- Q. Um-hum. And a, what' the position of both vehicles at that time?
- A. Well mine was heading to the north or to the left I mean.
- Q. Veah.
- A. And he was headed to the north.
- Q. Okay now in regards to the exact location on the roadway, now there was two lanes right running north?
- A. Yes.

- Q. Now approximately a were you present the first lane running north and into the second or are you still in the first lane running north?
- A. I was past the first lane.
- Q. And approximately how far were you into the second lane?
- A. Oh I would say approximately halfway.
- O. Halfway, okay. Now where exactly did he hit your car at or did you hit him?
- A. It was on the....
- Q. In regard...
- A. It would be the right hand side front.

- Q. Where on the fender or ...
- A. Approximately on the center of the car.
- Q. In the center of the car.
- A. A little to the right.
- Q. Okay and a, what about a after the impact a, where did the vehicles end up at. Did you stop right then or did the other....
- A. I we both stopped right there.
- Q. And his cycle just fell over right there then?
- A. Yeah it was just under my bumper.
- Q. Okay a, and he hit you about right in the middle of the car then, about the the driver's door?
- A. No, the front off center on front to the right.
- Q. Oh in the very front of the car?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Okay and where....could you try to pinpoint the exact location was it on the fender or on the grille or...
- A. It was...would be on the grille and hood.
- Q. Grille and hood. Okay a, now did you take any type of action to avoid the impact?
- A. Well no but I, as I said I never seen him.
- Q. Yeah. Okay a, were there any skid marks. Did he leave any skid marks at the... were there any skid marks at all at the scene of the accident?
- A. I don't believe there was.
- Q. Okay what, comments were exchanged between you and the other party at the scene of the accident?
- A. I had no words with him whatsoever.
- Q. Okay, was there any drinking going on in either one of the a vehicles involved in the accident that you know of?
- A. No I would say there, to my knowledge there was none.
- Q. Okay were there any witnesses to the accident that you know of?
- A. Well there was one fellow come there I don't know whether he seen it or heard it or what but the police took his, took a statement from him and he took right on off again.
- Q. Okay a, now what was the appearance apparent damage to your car and to his motor-cycle?
- A. Well I would say his motorcycle was totaled.
- Q. Yeah.
- A. My car probably a hundred dollars.
- Q. Okay now was there anyone, was there any evidence of injuries at the scene?

- Q. Yes.
- Q. Um-hum. And who was injured?
- A. The man on the cycle.
- Q. Okay was this a man or a boy?
- A. Well I would say he was around 18.
- Q. Yeah. Okay were the police there?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Which police department?
- A. North Las Vegas.
- Q. Was there an ambulance there?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Okay how about tow trucks, any tow trucks?
- A. Well a tow truck picked up the cycle.
- Q. Okay Mr. Monit is there anything you'd like to add to your statement that hasn't been covered before?
- A. Well as I said they ain't a thing I can say because I just didn't see.
- Q. Okay. Once again Mr. Monk, do you realize that the con...this conversation is being recorded and is it with your full knowledge and consent?
- A. I am.
- Q. And the facts you just stated to the best of your knowledge the truth?
- A. That's right.
- Q. Okay that ends the statement.
