MEETING OF THE SENATE STANDING COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE

Date: April 15, 1971

Chairman Close called the meeting to order at 1:17 P.M.

<u>AB 148</u> - Creates consumer protection responsibilities in office of Attorney General.

Senator Drakulich made a motion to pass the bill with an amendment giving the responsibility to the Department of Commerce. The motion died because of the lack of a second.

Senator Lamb made a motion to "do pass" as is; seconded by Senator Hecht. The vote was-- For: Lamb, Hecht, Swobe. Against: Close and Drakulich.

<u>AB 249</u> - Provides for professional development of real estate brokers.

This bill was discussed in detail and Senator Drakulich said it is too restrictive. He made a motion to "kill" the bill; seconded by Senator Lamb. The vote was--For: Drakulich, Lamb, Hecht, Swobe. Against: Close.

<u>AB 558</u> - Permits consumers to avoid purchases from door-to-door salesmen.

Senator Lamb made a motion to kill the bill; seconded by Senator Hecht; motion carried.

<u>AB 682</u> - Provides for reports and payment of license fees for Nevada Athletic Commission.

Senator Drakulich made a motion to "do pass". The motion died because of the lack of a second.

Senator Swobe made a motion to "kill" the bill; seconded by Senator Lamb. The vote was--For: Swobe, Lamb, Hecht, Drakulich. Against: Close.

Senate Committee on Commerce

<u>AB 748</u> - Creates Public Service Commission Publication Fund; provides for certain hearings by Public Service Commission; imposes penalties for false, fraudulent statements.

Senator Swobe made a motion to "do pass"; seconded by Senator Lamb; motion carried.

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<u>AB 732</u> - Establishes Nevada Factory-Built Housing Law.

Senator Close announced some new amendments to the bill. After discussion, Senator Drakulich moved to "do pass as amended"; seconded by Senator Swobe; motion carried.

<u>AB 263</u> - Establishes Advisory Employment Agency Board, new limitations on rates of employment agencies and new licensing requirements.

Senator Close announced an amendment which would change the fee to 30% of the first month's salary.

Following discussion, Senator Swobe moved to "kill" the bill without the new amendment; seconded by Senator Lamb. The vote was--For: Swobe, Lamb, Hecht, Drakulich. Against: Close.

The meeting adjourned at 1:36 P.M.
