MINUTES

January 25, 1971

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Monroe at 10:07 a.m.

S.B.#2 - Increases public administrator's bond in certain counties.
Senator Close

Senator Close gave a brief summary of why the bill was necessary. Senator Dodge commented that the bill should cover all counties, not just the smaller ones. He suggested that an intermediate dollar level be set in the smaller counties. Senator Close agreed. There was some discussion as to the price of fiduciary bonds, and Senator Close was asked to investigate the cost of these bonds. This bill will be discussed further tomorrow.

S.B. #7 - Prohibits possession or withholding of stolen goods.
Senator Monroe

Chairman Monroe advised that he considered this bill just a technical change. However, Senator Dodge suggested that they go over the bill more closely with Grant Davis of the Legislative Counsel. This bill will be further discussed tomorrow.

S.B. #8 - Clarifies language pertaining to State Board of Health rules and regulations.
Senator Monroe

Senator Dodge suggested that Ernest G. Gregory of the Environmental Health Department sit in on our meeting tomorrow to discuss this bill.

S.B. # 13 -Prohibits private practice of law after a certain date by Attorney General and certain district attorneys.
Senators Young, Walker, and Wilson

Senator Young advised that he would like to have a hearing on this bill, including certain district attorneys and the Attorney General. A Public hearing was set up for 10:00 a.m. on Monday, February 1, 1971, in the Judiciary Committee Room, No. 213.

S.B. #14 - Makes gambling checks and other evidences of indebtedness enforceable.
Senators Lamb, Close, Gibson, and Herr



There was some discussion as to the effect the "long arm" statute would have on this bill, and the fact that a judgement could be gotten by default. This bill will be held up for discussion by the committee.
