COMMITTEE: COMMERCE

DATE: Friday, March 30, 1973

Chairman Prince called the meeting to order at 4:25 p.m. Mr. Capurro stated that he had the amendments to AB 740.

Chairman Prince stated that he would set SB 250 regulating marriage counselors for hearing.

The Committee agreed to approve HR 5683 to President Nixon regarding electrification interest rates.

Mr. Torvinen suggested including some language from AB 117 of the last session in AB 690. Mr. Capurro moved to pass the bill as amended. Mr. Bickerstaff seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

Mr. Demers moved to pass AB 686 regarding the solvency test. Mr. Capurro seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

Mr. Torvinen moved to pass AB 687 regarding the unemployment fund deleting Section 5. Mr. Capurro seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

Mr. Capurro moved to pass AB 827 changing supervision of "pre-need" plans from the Insurance Commission to Superintendent of Banks. Mr. Demers seconded the motion. The motion was passed with Mr. Wittenberg voting "nay".

Mr. Torvinen moved to pass AB 688 requiring employees to work at jobs for which they may be over-qualified. Mr. Wittenberg seconded the motion. The motion was passed with Mr. Demers voting "nay"

Mr. Torvinen moved to pass AB 695 deleting "which is in excess of \$5.00". Mr. Capurro seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

After considerable discussion, Chairman Prince appointed a subcommittee composed of Messrs Wittenberg, Bickerstaff, and Capurro to study AB 691 and present amendments to the Committee.

Mr. Capurro moved to indefinitely postpone AB 876 regarding

payments to subcontractors. Mr. Wittenberg seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

Mr. Wittenberg moved to indefinitely postpone AB 685 regarding diverting construction funds. Mr. Bickerstaff seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously passed.

Mr. Dini moved to pass AB 562 regarding shopping carts. Mr. Capurro seconded the motion. Mr. Wittenberg moved to amend Mr. Dini's motion by indefinitely postponing the bill. Mr. Bickerstaff seconded Mr. Wittenberg's motion. The amended motion was passed with Messrs Capurro and Dini voting "nay".

Mr. Capurro moved to pass AB 587, a bill regarding electrical wiring in mobile homes. Mr. Wittenberg seconded the motion. The motion was approved with Mr. Bickerstaff abstaining.

Chairman Prince adjourned the meeting at 6:00 p.m.
