Chairman Schofield opened the meeting by asking if the minutes of the last meeting had been read and if they were approved.

Mr. Barengo made the motion to approve the minutes.
Mr. McNeel seconded the motion.
Motion carried unanimously.

Chairman then opened the discussion of AB 136, the first item on the agenda. This bill prohibits establishment of attendance areas within school districts and transportation of pupils to attend school in certain counties.

Assemblyman Lowman explained the measure somewhat and said that the main intent was to get the schools out of the busing business. He said that line three is the cogent section and line 43 on page two is the other.

Richard Morgan asked if the bill said anything about children that were transported out of the State education is is there anything in there for the mentally retarded.

Robert Best said that matters of this nature should be a management problem. This is what the Clark County people elected the school board for.

After some more short discussion it was decided to talk more on this subject on the hearing date March 5 at 4:00 P.M., Room 336.

AB 193, the bill to raise the driver education fee from \$30.00 to \$35.00 was brought up next.

Assemblyman Vergiels made the motion to do pass AB 193.
Assemblyman Barengo seconded.

Robert Best explained that this bill simply provided for the inflationary costs that accrue and would during the next biennium.

Vote then taken by Chairman on AB 193
Motion passed unanimously.

Chairman then asked what the Committee's pleasure would be on AB 194, which repeals provisions for school attendance areas.

Assemblyman Margie Foote suggested we keep 194 with 136 and discuss them both at the hearing March 5th.

No motion or action was taken on this but generally decided to do so.

Chairman next took up the matter of SB 48, a bill which provides for shortening coverage of comprehensive plans of U. Of N. System.

It was decided to invite Senator Dodge to meet with Committee on March 7th at 4:00 at regular Wednesday meeting in Room 336 to explain this bill in more detail.

Mr. Lowman spoke on BDR 34-792^{*}, a bill which provides for research on tapping sun rays for energy and explained it.

After short discussion in which Mr. Vergiels expressly asked that it be included in the minutes that there would be no question of financing in this bill and Mr. Lowman answered that it would not now or at any time motion was made by Margie Foote to introduce the bill.

Assemblyman Vergiels seconded the motion.
Motion carried unanimously.

Chairman then made an announcement that there would be a meeting of the Education Sub Committee Tuesday morning with Washoe and Clark County delegates in Room 234. He was asked who the members of the Sub Committee were and Chairman said that himself, Hal Smith and Randy Capurro of the Ways and Means Committee were appointed from the Assembly and that Senator Gibson and Cliff Young represented the Senate.

Meeting adjourned at 5:00 P.M.
