April 2, 1973 ¹²⁶

Chairman Schofield convened the meeting at 4:15 P.M. by bringing up a new bill, AB 932, for discussion. This bill makes more explicit provision for study of state and federal constitutions, history and government in public schools.

After brief discussion it was decided to hear this bill Monday, April 9th.

SB 214 which repeals provision authorizing school boards to exclude all children under 6 years of age was discussed next.

John Gamble spoke on this and said this could be discriminatory as written

Later Mr. Vergiels moved to do pass this bill, SB 214.

Dr. Broadbent seconded.

Motion passed unanimously.

Assemblyman Barengo to speak on it.

SB 473 was briefly discussed. Mr. Gamble spoke on it and said it was just a technical bill, an amendment updating language of provision for duty to repair defective school vehicles.

Dr. Broadbent moved to do pass.

Lowman seconded.

Motion unanimously approved.

Dr. Broadbent to introduce.

SB 474, a bill which deletes obsolete reference to "educational supervision district" was briefly discussed with John Gamble explaining.

Assemblyman Margie Foote moved to do pass.

Assemblyman Vergiels seconded the motion.

Unanimously passed.

Mr. Vergiels to speak on it.

AB 510, the University educational accountability which had had much discussion previously was brought out.

Mr. Barengo moved to indefinitely postpone this one.

Assemblyman Vergiels seconded the motion.

Motion carried with Mr. Lowman and Dr. Broadbent dissenting.

AB 639 which is a bill to make attendance officer classified employee of certain school districts which had been much discussed previous to this meeting was briefly discussed once more and Mr. Vergiels moved to do pass after Mr. Barengo and Lowman had met with Mr. Taylor and changed it somewhat.

Miss Foote seconded the motion to pass AB 639.
Motion passed unanimously.
Mr. Lowman to introduce.

AB 815 a bill which increases durational residence requirement for University and college tuition purposes.

Mr. Barengo moved to indefinitely postpone AB 815.
Lowman seconded the motion.
Motion to postpone passed unanimously.

Meeting was adjourned by Chairman Schofield at 6:00 P.M.

*The order of business of action on the above bills was carried out after participants had left the room.

Additional action taken not included in the above was on AB 379 concerning confidentiality of students records was motion made by Mr. Lowman to do pass.
Motion seconded by Dr. Broadbent.
Mr. Lowman to speak.
