The Environment & Public Resources committee was called to order by Chairman Bremner at 9:05 a.m.

The chairman said that Assembly Joint Resolution #9 would be discussed and decided on this morning. AJR-9 memorializes the Congress of the United States to enact legislation so that the Red Rock Recreation Lands be transferred to the Nevada Park System. Mr. Lowman made a motion to pass this resolution, and Mr. Banner seconded his motion. All members voted aye.

Jean Ford commented about the budget and was asked by Mr. Lowman about the private lands within the Red Rock Recreation Lands. She answered that 360 of the 77,000 acres were privately owned, *which* and ~~possibly we would get it~~ within the next six months.

Chairman Bremner announced that a hearing about AB-131 (the Bottle Law) would be held on Wednesday, February 14, 8:00 a.m. in room 214.

Mrs. Ford and Dr. Broadbent discussed the differences in the bottle companies' opinions and their concern about the bill. Mr. Jacobsen said that if the bill passes, ~~it~~ will definitely increase costs, because of the extra expenses of the manufacturers in maintaining the bill.

Mr. Smalley thought something ought to be done with the paper and plastic cups that one gets in theatres and drive-in restaurants, because they cause just as much of the litter problem as bottles and cans do.

No further business needed to be discussed, so the chairman adjourned the meeting until Wednesday morning at 8:00 a.m.
