FRIDAY APRIL 13, 1973

Chairman Bennett called the meeting to order at 7:40 a.m. The first bill to be discussed was SB 248.

Mr. George T. Bennett, an inspector for the State Board of Pharmacy, and George R. Tucker, Nevada State Pharmaceutical Association, appeared in support of the bill. This bill has to do with reducing the number of years' experience to become a member of the Board from 10 to 5, as they have found many competent pharmacists have not been here 10 years. It also provides for continuous supervision of a pharmacist in hospitals with 100 or more beds, and in hospitals with less than 100 beds a pharmacist who is to be absent may designate a person to obtain drugs in case of emergency. It also provides other regulatory features. They stated there is no difference between hospital pharmacists and community pharmacists and perhaps the word "shall" in s/s 3 of Section 1 (line 8 page 1) should be "may".

SB 335. Mr. Bennett and Mr. Tucker also appeared in support of this bill . It merely requires the continuing education of pharmacists as a prerequisit to registration or renewal of registration. The medical profession and U.S. Pharmacy Assn. are 100% behing it.

SB 337. Mr. Bennett and Mr. Tucker again discussed and supported this bill. It is more or less a house cleaning

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measure. The deletion on line 7, page 1, is necessary because it is illegal under Federal and State regulations. The word "narcotics" is changed to "controlled substances". The requirement that a registered pharmacist be a citizen of the United States or eligible for citizenship has been found to be unconstitutional, and the Attorney General says they might as well remove it. They are also requesting that only 100 hours of practice in a year is required instead of 500 for a renewal receipt. They feel that continuing education is more important than hours. They also explained various other aspects of the bill.

<u>SB 341</u>. Mr. Bennett and Mr. Tucker explained that this was probably the most important bill to the Board of Pharmacy. During the 1971 Session Chapter 454 of the old bill referring to dangerous drugs was inadvertently repealed. This is not a change of law, merely reinstateing what was in the law before.

<u>SB 454</u>: Robert Edmondson of the Attorney General's office stated he had drafted the bill and the basic intent is to improve emergency medical service and upgrade all aspects thereof. There has been considerable review all over the State and the bill has widespread support from all medical societies. This bill is also part of a package - other bills are <u>AB 127</u> and <u>\$CB 323</u> and this provides the regulatory part.

Mr. Robert Grayson, Attorney for the Clark County District Health Department, said that Washoe and Clark Counties are regulating ambulances and emergency medical services and they do not feel that this bill does not give local control to the extent that it should. He proposed various amendments to the bill - a copy of the suggested amendments is marked <u>Exhibit A</u>, attached hereto, and made a part of these minutes.

Tom Wilson of Comprehensive Health Planning feels that the amendments are superfluous - there will still be local control as there is now. There was a big meeting in Clark County where this bill was discussed and there was no opposition at that time. The bill is important and the introduction of these amendments may result in it not passing at this late date. There were statements by Gene Clock, Washoe Co. Dist Health Dept., for the amendments, and Larry G. Bettis, Dep. Attorney General for the Department of Health, Welfare & Rehabilitation, against the amendments.

Dr. Robert G. Whittemore, Nevada Board of Psychiatrists, urged support of <u>SB 384</u> (not on agenda) to protect the public from charlatans.

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S.B. 454

Proposed Amendments:

Page 6, §30, Line 27: Should read, "are exempted from licensure and permit provisions of this chapter."

After line 48, page 6: Add new subsection 8 as follows:

"Ambulance, air ambulance, attendants, volunteer attendants, or any person, firm, corporation, state or political subdivision providing ambulance service, regulated by any county, city or district board of health."

Page 7: Delete the existing §31(1); replace with:

"31(1) Any city, county or district board of health may adopt regulations governing ambulances, air ambulances, attendants, volunteer attendants, the operation of ambulance services by any person, firm, corporation, state agency or political subdivision, and providing for the issuance of permits therefor, and the licensure therefor, within the jurisdiction of such board of health, which local regulations shall become effective 30 days after approval by the State Board of Health.

Sections 31(2) and 31(3) remain "as is".

Page 7, after line 7: Add new subsection 4:

"Any regulations governing operation of ambulance services or the licensures or permits for such services and/or ambulance attendants and volunteer attendants, adopted by any county, city, or district board of health prior to the effective date of this act, shall remain in full force and effect unless rejected by the State Board of Health within 90 days following the effective date of this enactment."
