

SENATE COMMERCE AND LABOR COMMITTEE

MINUTES OF MEETING

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 4, 1973

The meeting was called to order at 12:00 noon.

Senator Drakulich in the chair.

S. B. 566 - Adopts National Electrical Code.

Bob Warren, Nevada Municipal Association, spoke in favor of the bill. He said it was a very desirable piece of legislation and had the unanimous support of the 16 city members.

Ronald M. Hall, Electrical Workers Local #401, appeared and spoke in favor of the bill. He feels it is very important legislation and urged do passage of the bill.

A letter from Bill Hancock, urging passage of the bill with the following amendment was read. Said letter is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

Mr. Hall endorsed the remarks made in Mr. Hancock's letter.

Motion, Senator Blakemore, Amend and Do Pass, seconded by Senator Herr, carried. Senator Swobe voting no.

S. B. 541 - Makes certain changes in regulation of private investigators and related occupations.

Bob Groves from the Attorney General's office spoke in support of the legislation. He indicated that Section 2 of the bill makes certain that there would be sufficient public liability insurance coverage before a license for any private investigator could be renewed. Section 3 sets out the 30 consecutive days of absenteeism from the state, and allows the party work for those 30 days temporarily. Section 4 is the disciplinary provision. Section 5 permits a private patrolman to investigate the theft, loss or concealment of property has been hired to protect. Section 6 subsection 5 changes the word "shall" to may and adds be regulation not inconsistent with this chapter." Section 7, subsection 5, subsection (b) deals with the certification from the secretary of state that the corporation is good standing, etc., subsection 5 permits the board to require payment of \$25 fee to cover the costs of a field examination, as a canine handler. Section 8 required the applicant to bear the costs of the background information. Section 9 is simply a housekeeping bill and is designed to make that language the same as 648.100. Section 10 requires the name of the person or persons affiliated with the corporation on the basis of whose qualifications such

license is issued. Section 13, subsection 4, special agent etc is removed and "by an employer regularly" is inserted and "if a bona fide employer-employee relationship exists."

Motion by Senator Swobe, Do Pass, seconded by Senator Hecht, carried.

S. B. 403 - Enacts the Nevada Occupational Safety and Health Act.

Ralph Langley, Director of Safety, NIC, appeared and spoke in support of the legislation. Mr. Langley presented amendments to the bill to the committee directly as the bill should be written. Said amendments are attached hereto as Exhibit C.

Motion, Senator Swobe, have the amended version of S. B. 403 reprinted and re-referred to committee, seconded Senator Herr, carried.

The matter was set for hearing on Wednesday, April 11, at the noon meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:35, p.m.
