MINUTES OF MEETING

FRIDAY, MARCH 2, 1973

Meeting called to order at 2:45 P.M.

Senator Wilson in the Chair.

PRESENT: Senator Blakemore Senator Dodge Senator Echols Senator Young Harry Gallaway, Department of Agriculture Fred Wright) State Fish and Game Department Bill Parsons)

<u>S. B. 195</u> - Requires labeling of commercial livestock feed supplements to show net weight and ingredients by percentage.

Discussion was held concerning true labeling of all ingredients in livestock commercial feed, and whether or not there would adequate funds for state testing. Concern was for the control of molybdenum in the feed.

Labels should include, but not limited to descriptions or statements of ingredients or the effects thereof.

Senator Dodge spoke in behalf of someone in the commercial feed business who might be requested to make a special feed under a certain formulation. An undue burden might be placed on that feed producer under the suggested bill. He further stated that the feed producer should not have to place the formulation on each billing to the customer under the bulk delivery situation where the feed producer has a regular service to his customer. A regulation should be set up to exempt him from listing the ingredients on each invoice, unless he changes his formula.

Senator Dodge moved Do Pass as amended and refer to finance. Seconded by Senator Blakemore and carried.

<u>S. B. 267</u> - Requires fishing, hunting or trapping licenses to indicate whether licensee has been issued special stamps, tags or permits.

Fred Wright and Bill Parsons of the Nevada Fish and Game Department appeared concerning the bill.

Mr. Wright stated that if the intent of the bill is that the Fish and Game designate on the back of the license those things that are required, he doesn't feel that legislation is necessary. NAME: NOT THE OWNER

He showed the brochure of rules and regulations which is put out by the Fish and Game for the benefit of the sportsman. The Committee was further informed that if these regulations were to be put on the licenses, it would cause a problem in printing for the Department. They must go to press in April.

The bill was tabled.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:15 p.m.
