Minutes of Meeting - January 30, 1973

The first meeting of the Committee on Education was held on January 30, 1973, at 2:45 p.m.

Chairman Foley called the meeting to order at 2:45 p.m. The first order of business was a review of the Committee Rules. Secator Hecht moved that the Committee Rules be adopted, seconded by Senator Bryan. Motion carried. (Copy of Rules attached herewith).

S.B. 48:

Chancellor Humphrey was called to the chair as witness. The Board of Regents authorized Senator Dodge to request this Legislation, and believes that the present long-term planning is highly desirable, but they cannot run effectively under this planning for a ten year period. Therefore, the four-year period, as stated in S.B. 48, is their desire. This proposed four-year plan would be updated every two years, i.e. in 1975 the Board of Regents would submit a plan that would take them to 1979, then in 1977 they would submit a plan that would take them to 1981.

It was moved by Senator Raggio and seconded for a "Do Pass" with the following amendment: Section 1. Line 5 "... plan for the next four years which explains:..." and Section 1. Lines 21 and 22 "...date for the ensuing four years, and shall present...". Senate Education Commi Minutes January 30, 1973

LAW SCHOOL:

After discussion, Chairman Foley commented that he would like to hold a joint hearing with the Assembly Committee on Education within the next two weeks, and would like to correlate this hearing with Assemblyman Jack Schofield and Chancellor Humphrey at a date when both would be free to attend.

YEAR-ROUND SCHOOL:

Senator Walker commented on year-round school, and suggested the Committee look into this issue.

Chairman Foley commented that letters would be written to the State Board of Education and different school districts and arrange for a hearing date.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:15 p.m.
