A.C.R. 48: Authorizes board of regents of University of Nevada to develop plans for establishing a law school at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

Justice Zenoff made reference to his remarks made at the law school hearing held on February 14, 1973. Judge Zenoff stated that since that time, he has acquired additional experience and information:

Feasibility Study - for what reason would this State spend that kind of money for something they already have the answers to. The Univ. of Hawaii spent \$25,000 for their feasibility study. This study simply shows what we already know.

Cost of Law School - On a three year basis, this state would have a law school of about 125 students. The library would cost \$350,000 to start and another \$50,000 to maintain. Jerry Mack will donate \$150,000 and will head a program to raise \$350,000. If the State will pay for operating expenses, Mr. Perry Thomas will see to it that we get the building.

Location - There is apathy in the North for the law school and enthusiasm in the South.

Senator Neal moved "Do Pass", seconded by Senator Bryan, unanimously carried.
