DISTRIBUTIVE EDUCATION FUND:

Page 11 (see supportive material file #2) is the guts of the distributive plan according to Mr. Liston. The money is distributed through the development of this ratio. In the least densely populated school district, Esmeralda County, there is one teacher for every 9.3 students. In the most densely populated, Clark County, there is one teacher for every 24.9 pupils. There is a \$9,000 value per teacher allotment.

The state allots up to 75% of transportation costs for the school districts. The counties pay the remainding costs. There is not much difference operating a station wagon with five students than a bus for eighty because most of the costs are for bus drivers' salaries. The state paid 50/50, sharing transportation costs with counties up until 1971. In 1971-72 the state paid 60%, and in 1972-73 they paid 75%.

The state now calculates allotments according to daily enrollment rather than daily attendance and this varies 4.5% statewide:

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Mr. Liston said they were experiencing something unusual and that was that local wealth was increasing faster than pupil growth.

NEVADA YOUTH TRAINING CENTER - CALIENTE - Pages 337-339:

The population is currently 74 girls. Committments to the Good Shepherd are up 100% and the committments to the Youth Training Center in Caliente are down 45%. The average stay for girls at the Training Center is 8.6 months, while the stay at the Good Shepherd is 15.2 months. The rate of recidivism over the last four years has been 28.06% and nationwide it has been 42% for girls. In 1971-72 the recidivism rate was 31.7%. The 28.06% is the lowest or next to lowest in the nation.

It costs \$6,536 per length of stay (8.6 months) and an annual cost of \$9,228. California pays \$12,000 per year.

Both the agency in Caliente and Elko have a reserve fund to provide for expenses in the event of population increases. Both have a cottage vacant at the present time.

Mr. Miller said Caliente was a good location because there was a good deal of community involvement such as individuals offering employment or recreational facilities. He said they are no longer experiencing problems recruiting people and having them relocate to Caliente.

Mr. Miller stated they weren't experiencing violence or runaways and said most of the girls had records of being beyond parental control, runaways, or incorrigible truancy.

Mr. Miller said they follow the girls until they reach the age of twenty. He said they are having a 94% success. He said he would like to have a Ph. D. level psychologist.

Mr. Miller also asked that consideration be given to a gymnasium as most of their recreation activity is indoors during nine months of the year.

He said they were getting a much more difficult girl and courts have indicated they will be getting more severaly disturbed girls than they have in the past.
