COMPUTER FACILITY:

Purchase of the computer is recommended by the Swackhammer efficiency report. This would cost a quarter of a million over a 72 month period and a total cost of 2.26 million. This would save, however, 1.25 million in expenses during the 72 month period alone. They are now renting the computer for \$55,000 a month.

The facility also asked for a new block power electrical system and new break diesel for the computer. Mr. Crosby said that most hospitals, police departments, etc., have this type of power system to provide electrical service during electrical storms and power failures. He said that from April to September, 1972, there were 21 power failures which put the computer out of service an average of 65.8 minutes per failure for a total of 23 hours down time. Twelve failures caused damage to the computer which cost an average of \$1,000 for repair for a total of \$12,000. It costs \$187.50 per hour to run the computer and this loss came to \$4,318. The Department of Motor Vehicles pays \$200 an hour in salaries and the failures caused a non-productive time of 23 hours or \$4,600 loss.
