Dr. Robinson asked if the committee would like to add a rule that any final voting action of the committee would not be made until all witnesses have been heard, questioned and dismissed and the chairman shall determine when a final action is to be taken. This was discussed by the committee and it was decided that this would be the practice of the committee but that it was not necessary to include it in the rules.

Dr. Robinson then moved that the rules be accepted as the operating rules for the Agriculture Committee for the 58th Legislative Session. Mr. Getto seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

Mr. Coulter moved that the meeting be adjourned and Mr. Getto seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 2:45.


