A quorum being present, Chairman Wittenberg called the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m. on April 22, 1975. The purpose of the meeting was to hear testimony on SB 212, SB 495 and AB 632.

Chairman Wittenberg called for testimony on SB 212, which adds to enumeration of causes and clarifies procedure for suspension or revocation of teacher's or school administrator's certificates.

John Gamble, State Department of Education, began by stating that they had sponsored this bill which had been amended and passed unanimously by the Senate Education Committee and then passed by the Senate itself. It provides for a more workable method for revocation or suspension of a teachers certificate. Under the present law, the local school district has had to bring charges against the teacher. This would allow the State Department of Education to bring the charges. The amendment to the bill was drawn up with the cooperation of NSEA, NSSBA and the Department of Education. They all believe this is a very workable bill.

Mr. Lowman asked who conducts the hearing and who appoints this person. Mr. Gamble stated that a hearing officer is appointed by the local school district to conduct hearings, the same as in the Professional Act.

Mr. Oakley, State Division of Mental Hygiene and Mental Retardation, stated that they had looked over the bill and discovered several errors that they feel should be corrected in this bill at this time before final passage. He stated that his background was in education and that he worked as a Educational Consultant to the Division. Mr. Oakley presented the committee with a statement from Jack Middleton, Associate Administrator of the Division which is attached to these minutes as Exhibit I and herewith made a part of this record.

Mr. Oakley questioned how you could take a diploma away from a person since a diploma and certificate are two different things.

Mr. Gamble explained that this language was used as there were still some teachers in the state that hold life diplomas. They have to keep this language in to cover those few.

Mr. Oakley then questioned whether this bill would entitle the Department to revoke certificates and diplomas in other states. Mr. Wittenberg stated that by definition this would be made perfectly clear.

Mr. Oakley then stated as far as the mental incapacity goes they have some clients at the Nevada Mental Institute who are treated for a very short period of time and could their diplomas be taken away from them. Mr. Lowman stated that he would feel that this is what should be done. Mr. Oakley stated that they feel that this is unjust .

Mr. Wittenberg stated that this bill would provide for hearing and thus he stated that he felt the teacher was well protected. Mr. Gamble stated that the reasons for revocation or suspension are the same as those for which an employee can be dismissed.

As there was no further testimony on SB 212, Chairman Wittenberg stated that he would interrupt the hearing long enough to allow Mr. Isom to present his statement to the Committee regarding the University of Nevada System.

Mr. Isom stated that he was a private citizen, a student at the University of Nevada-Las Vegas. He presented the committee with a prepared statement a copy of which is attached to these minutes as Exhibit II and herewith made a part of this record.

Mr. Isom then went through his statement and explained the various charts he had attached. He explained that on the last sheet the ones marked with * were those the University may not except but have not definitely decided upon and those marked with + were courses the University was completely rejecting. Mr. Isom stated that he found this very upsetting in that an individual attends the Community College in an endeavor to further improve himself. Then if he decides to go still further and attends the University he finds that he must duplicate his effort by taking the same course over again. He stated that he felt it was a power struggle within the system.

Mr. Lowman asked if there had been no indication of what courses were University equivalent in the catalog given out by the Community College. Mr. Isom stated that he was assured that these courses were transferrable to the University. However, he has since found out that this does not always work out. He further stated that he has submitted his records to the University at Provo, Utah and they have accepted the credits for transfer.

Mr. Lowman asked if any of the courses and textbooks of these courses were identical to University classes. Mr, Isom stated that his "Fundamentals of Accounting" course was taught by a University Professor with the same textbook used at the University, however, he said that perhaps this course was not called by the same title at the University.

Mr. Polish then asked who Mr. Isom has contacted at the two schools concerning this. Mr. Isom stated he had contact the following at Clark County Community College: Nick Horn, Dean of the Business School, Mrs. Brown, Registrar and Dr. Nicholson. At the University at Las Vegas he had contacted: Brock Dick, Dean Harbick, Mr. Sedman, Chairman of the Finance Department.

Mr. Wittenberg inquired as to what type of answers he was given. Mr. Isom replied that he was told the Community College had overstepped their bounds and that these courses did not meet the University standards, etc. He also stated that the only advice he got from his college advisor was to take the course over again, at the University.

Mr. Wittenberg asked Mr. Isom what exactly he would like to see done by the committee. Mr. Isom stated that he would to see the regents directed to remedy the situation so that the various Community Colleges would be compatable with the State University.

AB 632, directs State Department of Education to conduct pilot program for prekindergarten education for certain children.

Mr. Ogg, Washoe County School District, stated that should this bill be passed they stand ready to cooperate with the Department of Education in establishing this program.

Mr. Wittenberg asked if they feel that this is a good idea and bill. Mr. Ogg stated that yes they favor the idea of a pilot program, with some reservations. He elaborated on their reservations stating that they were mainly in the area of financing. Would there be adequate funds to properly staff. Also concern with the selection of students. It is difficult to define high incidences of low achievement in children that have never attended school. However, they feel these can all be resolved.

Mr. Polish asked about the size of classes as compared to kindergarten where most of the classes have from 30-35 students. Mr. Ogg stated that they feel there will probably be a maximum of 20 students in the pilot program.

Father Dunphy, Franciscan Center, stated that they support this concept as a means of addressing ourselves to the problems of the low income and ethnic groups. The problems has been that by the time the children reach school age they already lack some of the natural education other children recieve from their family

and which the teacher expects the child to have at that age. Feel it is necessary to combat this deficiency at this age to eliminate the problems these children already have by the time they reach school.

Mr. Gamble stated that it was clearly understood that by conducting this pilot program they would contract and work through Washoe County School District to offer this program.

He stated that the selection might be difficult to find proper students to meet the criteria set.

Mr. Wittenberg asked who had prepared the fiscal note. Mr. Gamble stated that they had not been requested to prepare one and they feel that the appropriation mentioned in the bill would probably be sufficient.

SB 495, changes name of State Advisory Council for Manpower Training and Career Education to Nevada Advisory Council for Vocational-Technical Education and reduces number of members thereof.

Mr. Gamble stated that he had not anticipated speaking on this bill, however he was familiar with it and had attended the hearing held on it in the Senate. He stated that they were in favor of the bill as it would reduce costs. The name change made the name more appropriate to the functions they provide. This also complies with federal regulations.

Mr. Morgan, NSEA, stated that this was Senator Blakemore's bill and that it was a good bill. The thrust of the bill recognizes the federal directive for reorganization of vocational advisory groups. Mr. Morgan cited the dramatic change that has occurred over the years since the federal government used to grant funds on behalf of math and science courses. Now the feds are going in for vocational education.

Chairman Wittenberg then called upon Mr. Morgan and Mr. Petroni to present their suggestions for AB 547. A general discussion period was held.

After the discussion period, Mr. Lowman moved the committee reconsider AB 547, which makes changes in provisions relating to educational personnel. Mr. Polish seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous. (Mr. Wittenberg, Mr. Polish, Mr. Coulter, Mr. Lowman and Mr. Weise with Mr. Vergiels excused and Mr. Chaney absent). See attached Legislative Action Form.

Mr. Lowman then moved that the committee "do pass as amended" AB 547. Mr. Weise seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous in favor. See attached Legislative Action Form.

Chairman Wittenberg appointed Mr. Polish to meet with Mr. Morgan and Mr. Petroni to see that the amendments were drafted properly. The suggested amendments are herewith attached to these minutes as Exhibit III and made a part of this record.

SB 212, Mr. Lowman moved "do pass" and Mr. Polish seconded the motion. The vote was 4 ayes, 1 not voting and 2 absent. Mr. Weise stated that since he had arrived after testimony was heard, he would not vote until he had read the minutes of this meeting.

AB 632, Mr. Polish moved "do pass" and Mr. Lowman seconded the motion. The vote was 4 ayes, 1 not voting and 2 absent. See attached Legislative Action Form.

SB 495, Mr. Polish moved "do pass" and Mr. Coulter seconded the motion. The vote was 4 ayes, 1 not voting and 2 absent. See attached Legislative Action Form.

Mr. Lowman stated that he would like to see some comments from the Chancellor's office regarding the statement made to the committee by Mr. Isom. Chairman Wittenberg instructed the secretary to write to Chancellor Humphrey regarding this matter and requesting that he attend or someone from his office appear at the next committee meeting to answer questions from the committee. A copy of this letter is attached to these minutes as Exhibit IV and made a part of this record.

As there was no further business to act upon, Chairman Wittenberg announced that the committee would meet next Tuesday, at which time he would ask from action on the bills that he still had in his possession, and then he adjourned the meeting.

MEMORANDUM

To: Assembly Committee on Education
From: Jack Middleton, Associate Administrator
Subject: SB 212

I have some concern with the general propriety of this legislation. My observations are as follows:

1. Suspension or Revocation of State Diploma

I perceive no problems with the Boards suspension or revocation of a state teaching certificate assuming certification is the states method of licensing teachers. However, it would seem that in order to revoke a diploma or educational degree of any kind the state should be able to demonstrate that the holder of such diploma engaged in some misconduct prior to the granting of such diploma and in relation to the earning of such diploma which would negate his right thereto.

2. Physical or Mental Incapacity

Aside from the apparent redundancy in subsections 1 and 2 of NRS 391.330, the phrase physical or mental incapacity is undefined in terms of nature or degree such that the Board would appear to be without adequate statutory standards or guidelines with which to judge a persons physical or mental capacity in relation to his fitness for service.

Your attention to these matters in connection with your consultation of SB 212 in sincerely appreciated.

POINTS FOR DISCUSSION REGARDING
THE UNIVERSITY OF NEVADA SYSTEMS

2-470

Statement: The University of Nevada Systems, as it is currently constituted, is headed by Chancellor Neil Humphrey. Within the system are the two Universities, the three Community Colleges, and Desert Research Institute. All three of these bodies are, in essence, sister schools. Since these are all sister schools, I would like to bring the following six points for your immediate evaluation and, hopefully, further discussion:

1. There is no uniformity within the University of Nevada Systems, particularly between the Universities and the Community Colleges, in the areas of course title and course number.
2. There is no uniformity in terms of acceptability and transferability within the University of Nevada Systems; again, particularly between the Universities and the Community Colleges. A particular problem that I particularly am faced with is that I may take a course from the Community College where the course is the same, the textbook is the same, and in instances, the instructor is the same, the only difference being the location and the course credit is the same; however, transferability between the Community College and the University of this and other particular courses, which I would be happy to discuss with you, has not been allowed. The only person who is suffering because of this arrangement is the person that the University of Nevada Systems is trying to help--being the student. Documentation for this is readily available, and I have xeroxed copies enclosed to support this statement.
3. Because of the conflict between the Universities and the Community Colleges in the areas of point #1 and #2 (uniformity and transferability) the student is forced to duplicate his education by taking the same classes from both institutions.
4. Community College catalogue should indicate transferability of courses so as not to confuse the student in terms of transferability, particularly in the areas of Community Service courses.
5. The Community Colleges are offering such courses as typing, that are readily acceptable at other four-year institutions outside of the state and, in some cases, at UNR; however, these courses are not acceptable at UNLV.
6. In discussing with my peers, I have found that transferability of courses from the Community College

is much easier to other Colleges and Universities outside of the state, rather than within the University of Nevada Systems, where all of the schools are sister schools.

The reason that I bring these six points to your immediate attention is that I do not feel that it has been the legislative intent to create a system where direct transferability would be impaired by the system; so I would like to propose that the legislature make their intent clearly known through a resolution that would call upon the Board of Regents to examine these problems and clearly propose a solution so that the student who is working within the system is not the one who suffers.
