MINUTES OF THE MEETING

January 30, 1975

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman. The Chairman stated that there was a quorum present at the meeting.

The Chairman proceeded to read the following BDR's for introduction to the Committee.

AB180

BDR 48-489. This bill was requested by the State Engineer, abolishing the hydrographic fund, concerning water rights. A motion was made by Mr. May for the introduction of BDR 48-489 and was seconded by Mr. Young. The motion was unanimously carried.

AB179

BDR 48-344 which permits the Administrator of Colorado River Resources and State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to contract for water and means of water delivery from the Colorado River. A motion was made by Mr. Young for the introduction of BDR 48-344 and was seconded by Mrs. Ford. The motion was unanimously carried.

AB177

BDR 36-133. This bill changes the name of the Civil Defense and Disaster Agency to the Office of Emergency Services and revises certain emergency provisions. This is called the Nevada Emergency Act. A motion was made by Mr. Moody for the introduction of BDR 36-133 and the motion was seconded by Mr. May. The motion was unanimously carried.

AB172

BDR 28-123. This bill was requested by the Public Works Board, which allows the Public Works Board to utilize construction management services procedures. A motion was made by Mr. Murphy for the introduction of BDR 28-123 and was seconded by Mrs. Ford. The motion was unanimously carried.

AB171

BDR 27-126. This bill eliminates aggregate provisions for local provisions in State Purchasing Act and makes using agencies responsible for current recordkeeping. A motion was made by Mr. Murphy for the introduction of BDR 27-126 and was seconded by Mr. Moody. The motion was unanimously carried.

AB175

Chairman Dini then announced to the Committee that he had some bills on the State Land Registrar and informed the Committee that he did not have the bill, but that it would be here shortly as a mistake was made on the bill and it was sent to the Senate. The bill had a Senate jacket on it, so it was sent back for an Assembly jacket. BDR 26-554. This bill makes the executive head of the Division of State Lands an administrator and corrects state land registrar. The Chairman then asked the committee if there was any discussion with regard to this bill. A motion was made by Mr. Young for the introduction of BDR 26-554 and was seconded by Mrs. Ford. The motion was unanimously carried.

AB173

BDR 26-553. This bill makes changes in the fee schedule of the State Land Registrar. A motion was made by Mr. Murphy for the introduction of BDR 26-553 and was seconded by Mr. Moody. The motion was unanimously carried.

AB174

BDR 26-224. This bill changes certain duties of State Land Registrar. This bill actually deals with the State Registrar furnishing copies of township plots, and changes the date from November 1 to August 1. A motion was made by Mr. May for the introduction of BDR 26-224 and was seconded by Mrs. Ford. The Motion was unanimously carried.

AB176

BDR 23-501. This bill extends certification of eligibles in classified service to include all persons having 5 highest percentage scores. This is an Act relating to the classified service of the State Personnel System. A motion was made by Mr. May for introduction of BDR 23-501 and was seconded by Mr. Young. The motion was unanimously carried.


AB178

BDR 27-127. This bill provides for an increase in formal bidding limit for state purchases, and raises that from \$500.00 to \$2,500.00. A motion was made by Mr. Young for the introduction of BDR 27-127 and was seconded by Mr. May. The motion was unanimously carried.

Chairman Dini asked the Committee if they had any further comments. Speaker Ashworth asked Chairman Dini if all of the bills had been introduced. Chairman Dini acknowledged that they had and that they numbered eleven.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, the meeting adjourned.
