MINUTES OF THE MEETING

March 10, 1975

(The following bills were discussed at this meeting: <u>S.J.R. 7</u> and <u>S.B. 185</u>).

Chairman Dini called the meeting to order at 9:05 A.M. The secretary called the roll.

The first bill on the agenda was <u>S.J.R.</u> 7. Mr. Dini stated that he thought that the assembly had passed a bill similar to this one last week. Mrs. Ford stated that it was A.J.R. 9 and that it came out of the Transportation Committee.

Mr. Armstrong stated that it had passed the Assembly on March 7th.

Mr. Dini stated that the committee would wait until a further date to hear <u>S.J.R. 7</u>.

The next bill on the agenda was <u>S.B.</u> 185, which allows the state board of examiners to authorize petty cash account for state agency. Mr. Earl T. Oliver testified with regard to this bill. He stated that this is a bill that they asked to be introduced and the purpose of the bill is that it allows the board of examiners to authorize petty cash accounts for state agencies, with a \$100 limit on the amount of the petty cash fund that they could authorize.

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He stated that the agency would be required to define the purpose and how it would be used and to provide the replacement of the account from the agency's budget resources. Mr. Oliver stated that the Board of Examiners has technically not had the authority but they have authorized these kinds of accounts.

Mr. Dini asked if everyone was bonded.

Mr. Oliver stated that every state employee was bonded.

Mr. Young asked what the difference was between petty cash and miscellaneous.

Mr. Oliver stated that petty cash would be an expenditure for whatever purpose which would be limited to less than \$100.00. It would be kept either in the agency's office or in a bank account

Mr. Dini asked if there were any questions.

Mr. Guernsey stated that they supported the legislation, and that it was currently going on.

Mr. Moody made a motion for a "do pass" on <u>S.B.185</u>, which was seconded by Mrs. Ford. All of the committee members were in favor of the motion and it was unanimously carried.

Mr. Dini asked if any of the subcommittees had anything to report.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, the meeting adjourned at 9:20 A.M.
