(The following bills were discussed: S.B. 612, S.B. 412, S.B. 357, SJR 18, SJR 38.)

Chairman Dini called the meeting to order at 10:20 A.M. with a quorum present.

Mr. Richard Serdoz testified on S.B. 612. He stated that this bill was fine before it was amended. He stated that he agrees with the study, but not as a statutory moritorium.

Mr. Craddock asked if they had to comply with the federal laws what we would be short on. He stated that they had gone beyond what we would have had to comply with.

Mr. Bob Quinn testified next. He stated that he helped to develop this legislation. He stated that the 1973 Legislature had authorized license inspection stations. That program went until July 1st of next year.

Mr. Silva testified next again. He stated that the department was concerned about the amendment. They find no problem with the bill before it was amended. The committee then discussed the bill with Mr. Silva.

The next bill to be discussed was S.B. 412. Mr. Broadbent testified. He stated that he had spoken to the District Attorney

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and that it was okay. Mr. Young stated that he did not know whether or not it was okay with the county commissioners.

Mr. Harmon moved for a do pass which was seconded by Mr. Murphy. The motion carried unanimously.

The committee then discussed S.B. 357. Mr. Bob Warren stated that there has been a limit placed on the amount of dollars that they can spend. The Sparks people indicated that if it were appropriate they would place a limit on their project that would run about \$6,000,000. The Southern Pacific Railroad has testified that they no longer oppose this language. Mr. Soderblum now supports it.

Mr. Murphy moved for a do pass which was seconded by Mr. Young.

Mr. May stated that this was a modified form of urban renewal.

The motion carried unanimously. Mr. May voted no for the do pass on S.B. 357.

The committee next discussed SJR 18. Mr. Young moved for a do pass with no recommendation which was seconded by Mr. Moody. Mrs. Ford stated that she opposes that because if we pass this out everyone will square off.

The vote was as follows:

Mr. Craddock, no, Mr. Harmon, yes, Mr. May no, Mr. Dini yes, Mr. Murphy no, Mrs. Ford no, Mr. Young yes, Mr. Moody yes. Mr. Schofield was not present at the time of the meeting. The vote was 4 to 4 and the motion did not carry.

The next bill to be discussed was SJR 38. Mr. Young moved for a do pass which was seconded by Mr. Craddock. The motion carried. Mrs. Ford voted no. Mr. Murphy and Mr. Schofield were not present at the time of the vote.

Mr. Silva again discussed S.B. 612 with the committee. He stated that as the bill is now with the amendment, they would have trouble enforcing it. The committee took no action on this bill today.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, the meeting adjourned.
