ASSEMBLY JUDICIARY COMMITTEE 58th NEVADA ASSEMBLY SESSION

MINUTES

February 20, 1975

Chairman Barengo called to order this meeting of the Assembly Judiciary Committee at the hour of 12:08 p.m. on Thursday, February 20, 1975.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Messrs. BARENGO, BANNER, HEANEY, LOWMAN, POLISH, SENA, Mrs. HAYES and Mrs. WAGNER.

MEMBERS ABSENT: Mr. HICKEY.

The purpose of this meeting was to hear Mrs. Shirley Boyers' testimony relative to a new program starting in the Clark County area. Mrs. Boyers is Chairman of the Clark County Corrections Committee. The program is funded by CETA to enable youthful offenders (when approved by the courts and the Metro police) to be enrolled in a program to function out in society instead of being placed in confinement in the Clark County Jail. This program is funded and does not need funds which have to be approved by the Nevada State Legislature. They have been allocated the sum of \$8,000 per man or woman for the job program and the sum of \$7,500 for vocational training for a man. Mrs. Boyers stated that presently with the youth in jail, they are not being trained to live in society or helped to "put one foot out".

Mr. Lowman stated that he requested this bill in December before the Legislature convened.

Mr. Heaney entered the meeting at this point.

Mr. Lowman continued that he intends to ask the Assembly Judiciary Committee to sponsor the bill.

Mrs. Wagner asked Mrs. Boyers if she would be back to testify before this Committee when the bill is considered. Mrs. Boyers said that she would.

Attached to these Minutes is a copy of Mrs. Boyers' agency's approval. This is in the form of a letter dated January 17, 1975 to Mrs. Boyers from CETA.

There being no further business, a motion for adjournment of this meeting was made and seconded. Chairman Barengo then adjourned the meeting at 12:15 p.m.
