The meeting was called to order at 9:01 by Mr. Mann, who presided at the meeting. Mr. Mann explained that this meeting was to discuss A. B. 181 and A. B. 182, he added that the committee would not take final action at this time on these two bills. A later meeting would be scheduled to do so.

ASSEMBLY BILL 181

Colonel Burns and Major General Edsall testified to the committee regarding A. B. 181. They explained that this bill is mainly to be used as an incentive to guardsmen to remain in the Nevada Guard. They related that the Guard is having a difficult time keeping up manpower strength. The Guard cannot continue to lose members and still meet the standards they should. The Guard now has the major backup responsibility now that the volunteer army is in effect. The Guard faces the possibility of having parts of its force moved out of state if they don't keep up their strength. They need this bill as an incentive to keep members in. They added that the school bill that was passed by the last session of the legislature, was very effective and that this license privilege could be another incentive.

M. K. Blomdal then testified that the other reservists of Nevada, Naval Reserve and Marine Reserve, feel that they are being discriminated against because this benefit is only for the Nevada Guard.

There being no testimony on A. B. 182, the meeting was adjourned by Mr. Mann at 9:46.

<u>BDR Number</u>	<u>Subject</u>
32-97	Provides for assessing and taxing mobile homes as real property at option of owner.
32-95	Provides an election to pay property tax levied against mobile homes in quarterly payments.
32-101	Provides a redemption period for mobile homes prior to seizure and sale for delinquent taxes.
-99	Resolution directing the Nevada Tax Commission to study the stratification methods of depreciation.
32-96	Provides for distribution of a portion of the city-county relief tax collected from the sale of a mobile home to the county of its location if different from the county of sale.
43-100	Provides a mobile home trip permit in lieu of registration and licensing requirements.
-98	Resolution directing the Nevada Tax Commission to budget for a computerized property valuation program.
