TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE  
January 30, 1975

Affairs Committee meeting.)

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Glover at 11:40 A.M.

The first Bill discussed, BDR-43-320, increases minimum gross weight and otherwise revises brake equipment requirements for trailers and other vehicles. Mr. Jacobsen moved for Committee introduction of the Bill; Mr. Dreyer seconded, and the motion was passed unanimously.

Discussion continued on the following:

BDR-43-325--this bill changes provisions concerning windshield wipers on vehicles. Mr. Dreyer made a motion fro Committee introduction of the Bill; it was seconded by Mr. Jacobsen and passed unanimously.

BDR-43-308--This bill provides changes in traffic laws on right of way. Mr. Jacobsen moved for Committee introduction of the Bill; Mr. Dreyer seconded, and it was passed unanimously.

BDR-43-295--This bill transfers certain driver license revocation provisions. Mr. Howard moved for Committee introduction of the Bill; Mr. Dreyer seconded, and it was passed unanimously.

BDR-43-273--This bill Expands peace officer powers of field dealer inspectors of vehicle compliance and enforcement section of registration division of Department of Motor Vehicle and provides for their early retirement. Mrs. Hayes moved for Committee introduction of the Bill; Mr. Jacobsen seconded, and it was passed unanimously.

BDR-43-279--This Bill exempts certain license plates from duplicate or substitute plate fees and clarifies fee requirement for substitute certificates, decals and plates. Mr. Dreyer moved for Committee introduction of the Bill; Mrs. Hayes seconded, and it was passed unanimously.

Chairman Glover read one other request to have a bill drafted to change Nevada license requirement when person becomes a Nevada resident. The law would read: When a person becomes a resident of Nevada as defined in chapter 482 and 483 of NRS he must, within 45 days, obtain a Nevada driver's license as a prerequisite to driving any motor vehicle in the State of Nevada. Mr. Jacobsen

made a motion for Committee introduction; Mr. Dreyer seconded, and it was passed unanimously.

Mr. Jacobsen made a motion to adjourn; Mr. Dreyer seconded, and the meeting was adjourned at 12.00 p.m.
