Chairman Glover called the meeting to order at 3:30 p.m.
The first bill discussed was:

A.B. 418 Authorizes department of motor vehicles to enter into reciprocal interstate agreements guaranteeing appearance of nonresident drivers charged with traffic violations

Bill Fitzpatrick, Dept Motor Vehicle, spoke against the bill. He stated that the Dept. had checked with the five states bordering Nevada, and none of them have such a law. He said the Dept of Motor Vehicles Administrator's convention would be held in Albuquerque, New Mexico next month, and at this time Nevada's DMV could present this idea to see if any of the other states would be interested in this type of agreement.

Howard Hill, Dept Motor Vehicle, also spoke against the bill. He said that it would require a lot of paper work from the personnel standpoint. He stated that Nevada does not even have a law now that gives DMV the power to suspend a person's license if he fails to appear in court. He indicated that we should try to get it in our own state first.

Mrs. Hayes asked if any other states had such a law. Mr. Fitzpatrick said none that he knew of.

Mr. Howard felt that we would have too many problems trying to administer this .

Virgil Anderson, AAA, stated one problem would be that a Nevada driver could be cited in another state but yet his citation might be perfectly legal in Nevada.

Mr. Dini moved to indefinitely postpone A.B. 418. Mr. Jacobsen seconded, and the motion was unanimous.

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A.B. 439 Includes travel trailers in requirement for vehicle registration and payment of registration fee.

John Ciardelli, Dept Motor Vehicle, explained that this was just a housekeeping bill. The only change is the addition of the word "travel trailer" on second page line 19.

S.B. 257 Provides for permit to move certain vehicles under specified circumstances

Chairman presented an amendment which was drawn by Assemblyman Mann at the request of one of his constituents. (See attached)

John Ciardelli, Dept Motor Vehicle spoke for the bill. He stated it was an accommodation bill to allow a person to be issued a temporary permit (free) to drive his vehicle until he has completed all the processing and is ready to register it. Mr. Ciardelli said he would be in favor of the amendment also which would allow a person 10 days in which to register his vehicle, and not require him to have a permit to drive the car.

Mr. Jacobsen was against the amendment. He wondered how a highway patrolman could identify that the vehicle was legal to be on the highway if there was no permit in window. He said a person could get stopped 10 times in 10 miles and this was just wasting everybody's time.

Howard Hill said the amendment would not eliminate sections 2 & 3 of the bill. A person could still get a permit if he desired but he would not have to.

As there was no other discussion, Chairman Glover declared a recess.

After the recess the following action was taken:

A.B. 439 Mr. Dreyer moved a Do Pass; Mr. Dini seconded and the motion was unanimous.

S.B. 257 Mr. Jacobsen stated that he was still against the amendment. He said 10 days was too long a period. A person would just wait 10 days if he has 10 days to register his car. He felt a person should have to get a permit and have it displayed in the window if he was driving an unregistered vehicle. Mr. Jacobsen then moved that the committee do not consider the amendment to S.B. 257; Mr. Howard seconded the motion, and it was unanimous.

Mr. Dini moved a Do Pass of S.B. 257; Mr. Jacobsen seconded, and the motion was unanimous.

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S.B. 118 Mr. Dini moved that the committee reconsider action wherein the committee postponed S.B. 118. Mrs Hayes seconded, and the motion was unanimous.

Mr. Dini explained that he had talked further with salesmen and realized that Nevada might lose many good salesmen if this 60 day permit were not issued. Mr. Dini moved a Do Pass of S.B. 118; Mr. Howard seconded, and the motion was unanimous, with Mr. Jacobsen voting No.

Mrs. Hayes presented the idea to the committee that they draft a bill requiring the use of our motto "Nevada bet on It" on our license plates. She said she had discussed this with Howard Hill and found it would only cost about \$3,000.00. She felt this was inexpensive advertising for our State. Mrs. Hayes moved that the committee introduce such a bill; Mr. Jacobsen seconded, and the motion was unanimous.

Chairman Glover appointed Mrs. Hayes as a committee of one to get the bill drafted.

Chairman Glover asked the following to speak on the bills on the floor: Mr. Dini S.B. 118; Mr. May S.B. 257.

As there was no other business the meeting was adjourned at 4:15 p.m.

Amendment No 5891



Amend section 1, page 1, by deleting lines 2 through 4 and inserting:

"thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

Sec. 2. 1. A Nevada resident, who has purchased from a person who is not a dealer, a vehicle which is:

Amend section 1, page 1, line 23, by inserting after the period the following:

"Sec. 3. A person other than a dealer or rebuilder, may operate a vehicle

on the highways of this state for 10 days without registering such vehicle pursuant to the provisions of this chapter and without obtaining a permit provided by section 2 of this act, if such person has in his possession:

1. A certificate of ownership or title, properly signed and dated, assigning the right to possession of such vehicle to such person;
2. A notarized contract of sale assigning to such person the right to possession of such vehicle; or
3. A dealer's report of sale."

Amend the title of the bill by deleting line 3 and inserting:

"purposes; clarifying right of new owner of vehicle to operate such vehicle for a limited period without registering it; and providing other matters properly relating thereto."
