

MINUTES

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE - NEVADA STATE LEGISLATURE - 58th SESSION

May 12, 1975

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Mello at 8:00 A.M. in the Ways and Means Committee Room.

PRESENT: Chairman Mello, Mr. Bremner, Mrs. Brookman, Mr. Dreyer, Mr. Glover, Mr. Howard, Mr. Robinson, Mr. Weise and Mr. Wittenberg.

ALSO PRESENT: John Dolan, Bill Bible, and Senator Cliff Young

SB 577 "Provides for submission to people of state bond issue for park purposes and acquisition of fish and game habitat." BDR S-1964

Senator Young explained this bill as authorization for the state to sell initial bonds totalling \$10 million in used grants for cities and counties for matching purposes. Washoe County is interested in purchasing property for a park, \$1 million would be used for wildlife acquisition, \$250,000 for historic preservation, \$500,000 for bicycle paths, etc. They would like to encourage more cities and counties to provide bicycle paths.

Supreme Court - Mr. Weise stated that the Law Clerk trains justices and the Secretary is a half-time researcher. Mr. Glover made a motion to reopen the budget. Mr. Wittenberg seconded. Motion passed with Mr. Bremner voting no. Mrs. Brookman made a motion to recommend a "Do-Pass" as recommended by the Governor. Mr. Dreyer seconded. Motion passed with Mr. Wittenberg and Mr. Robinson voting no.

Housing Division - Mr. Bremner made a motion to recommend a "Do-Pass" as recommended by the Governor. Mr. Dreyer seconded. Motion passed.

Motor Vehicle Inspection Program - SB 604 has \$33,000 provided in it. Mr. Wittenberg made a motion to reopen the Budget. Mrs. Brookman seconded. Motion passed. Mr. Wittenberg made a motion to close this budget with zero (0) appropriation. Mr. Dreyer seconded. Motion passed.

AB 505 "Authorizes state participation on behalf of Nevada citizens in certain proceedings involving federal tax regulations and makes appropriation." BDR 32-1473

Mr. Bremner made a motion to amend this bill (see attached) and reduce the \$100,000 appropriation to \$50,000. Mr. Wittenberg seconded. Motion passed with Mrs. Brookman voting no. Mr. Weise made a motion to recommend a "Do-Pass" as amended. Mr. Glover seconded. Motion passed with Mrs. Brookman voting no.

Mr. Wittenberg then gave the sub-committee report on the Unclassified Salaries. See attached for individual salaries. The changes from the list are as follows:

Mr. Wittenberg stated that all salaries were settled at 15% increase would receive a 4% in the second year. Any employee who started March 1, 1974 would only receive a 10% increase with a 4% in the second year. Some positions received from 12% to 20%.

Mr. Wittenberg made a motion to approve the recommendations of the sub-

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committee. Mr. Glover seconded. Motion passed with Mr. Weise voting no.

Mr. Wittenberg stated that in the Attorney General's office, the salary increase is 15% with a 4% in the second year and \$3000 for loss of private practice with the exception as follows:

The Chief Deputy in Carson City and the Chief Deputy in Las Vegas receive \$28,500 which includes \$3000 for the loss of their private practice and no increase in the second year.

Mr. Bremner made a motion to accept the sub-committee's recommendation. Mr. Wittenberg seconded. Motion passed with Mr. Weise voting no.

Chairman Mello stated that there is a Resolution for authorization to negotiate for the V and T and send it back to Ways and Means Committee. Mr. Glover so moved. Mr. Bremner seconded. Motion passed.

SB 352 "Expands age range within each special instruction or services to certain handicapped minors are provided." BDR 34-1125

Mr. Wittenberg explained that this allows an additional 12 special education units restricted to ages 3 to 5 years old. They feel that if they can reach the children at this young age they would be able to save several of them and they could attend the regular school.

Mr. Robinson stated that as soon as the Mentally Retarded children are diagnosed as Mentally Retarded they can participate as out-patients at the Mental Health Institute. When they reach school age they then attend the special education classes.

Mr. Wittenberg stated that the School District did not want this program last time because they did not have the teachers. The children were placed in a classroom full of regular students with untrained teachers of special education.

Mr. Weise felt that this was a very important time in a child's life, especially a special education child (from 3 to 5) and the Health Institute's are not staffed for full-time classes but for only an hour or two at a time.

Mr. Wittenberg made a motion to amend the age from 3 to 5, to 4 to 5, and amend the appropriation to \$96,000 per year. Mr. Bremner seconded. Motion failed. Mr. Wittenberg made a motion to pass the bill as written. Mr. Weise seconded. Motion failed.

Over

Distributive School Fund - Mr. Wittenberg made a motion to go with Senate Finance and delete what SB 352 provides for. Mr. Bremner seconded. Motion passed.

Mr. Wittenberg felt that the \$1 million appropriation for the Distributive School Fund should be increased to \$2 million by just taking \$ 1 million from the second year and placing it in the first year. There would be no increase in funds. He stated that this would make an even 18% and leave 5 1/2% to 6 % in the second year. If the trigger does not go through, it would allow from 1% to 2% raise in the second year for teachers and still leave enough money for the school districts to operate with. If the trigger does come through it would provide from 1 1/2% to 5% for the teachers to negotiate.

SB 151, "Makes appropriation to state distributive school fund." BDR S-775

Mr. Wittenberg made a motion to call back SB 151. Mr. Bremner seconded. Motion passed. Mr. Wittenberg made a ~~motion to~~ amend SB 151 from \$1 million to \$2 million. Mr. Glover seconded. Motion passed with Mr. Weise and Mr. Howard voting no. Mr. Wittenberg then made a motion to recommend a "Do-Pass" as amended. Mr. Glover seconded. Motion passed with Mr. Weise voting no.

University Budget - Page 160, Mrs. Brookman made a motion to reopen the budget. Mr. Dreyer seconded. Motion passed. Mr. Howard made a motion to adopt the change (see attached) and remove \$30,000 each year. Mrs. Brookman seconded. Motion passed. Mr. Dreyer made a motion to close the budget. Mr. Glover seconded. Motion passed.

Page 166 - Mr. Dreyer made a motion to reopen both Athletic budgets. Mr. Wittenberg seconded. Motion passed. Mr. Howard made a motion to add \$60,000 in the first year and \$64,000 in the second year with a letter of intent regarding the Women's Athletics. Mrs. Brookman seconded. Motion passed. Mr. Dreyer made a motion to close the budgets. Mr. Howard seconded. Motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 11:00 A.M.

MEMORANDUM

TO: Assemblyman Don Mello, Chairman, Assembly Ways and Means Committee

FROM: Howard E. Barrett

The Budget Office made a mistake in computing the Governor's Recommendations for Intercollegiate Athletics at UNR and UNLV. The Governor intended to provide General Fund support for three additional coaching positions for each campus to enable the University to provide additional funding for Women's Athletics as is federally required. The Budget Office felt we had done so and so indicated in the narratives in the Executive Budget. However, it was pointed out to us on May 8, 1975, that the \$50,000 increase in General Fund support really did nothing more than provide the 12.1% and 7% salary increases for the existing staff of coaches funded from the General Fund.

We would, therefore, like to recommend an additional \$60,000 for each campus for 1975-76 and \$64,000 for each campus for 1976-77 for the three additional coaching positions we originally felt had been included.

In discussing this with the Chancellor, he indicated that there would be a vacant position for the next biennium in the Systems Administration budget for UN and that \$30,000 could be removed from that budget for each year. We would appreciate your reconsideration of these budgets.
