#### SB 336 (See attached bill)

Senator Lamb read the amendments that are attached to the back of the minutes.

Senator Gibson — Amend and Do Pass Senator Young — 2nd Motion Carried.

Senator Lamb asked the Committee to consider retirement for the Sergeant of Arms. Senator Brown asked Mr. Ron Sparks to research the possibility of this.

#### SB 140 (See attached bill)

Senator Raggio said that he felt the installation ought to be finished on the system. Mr. Barrett said that this appropriation plus some additional funding will allow the small counties to tie into the system.

Senator Monroe asked if this will replace the Bell Telephone system in any way. Mr. Barrett said that this will not be used for intra-State agency communications, but only for law enforcement, and law enforcement data processing.

The Committee felt that it was important that the Communications Board should clearly understand the intent of the Committee in passing this bill. It was decided that the Chairman of the Committee would write a letter of the intent to the Board, (see attached).

### SB 217 (See attached bill)

Senator Raggio suggested that the bill be amended to include that a profile shot should be taken for persons under 21 years of age, for ready identification of minors. Senator Gibson suggested that on Page two, Sub-sections 2 and 3 should be reversed, and lines 24 and 25 should read Motor Vehicle Fund, instead of Highway Department Fund.

It was also discussed that if a minor should have a renewal at 20 years of age, he would have to pay the full fee for the full-face shot when he turned 21 years of age.

Senator Raggio -- Amend and Do Pass:

- 1) Requirement of profile shot for minors
- 2) Sub-sections 2 and 3 reversed on Page Two
- 3) Lines 24-25 will read "Motor Vehicle Fund", instead of "state highway fund", Page Two.
- 4) Line 13, Page Two, the fee shall be \$5.00, instead of \$1.00.

Senator Gibson -- 2nd Senator Young -- "NO" Motion Carried.

#### SB 187 (See attached bill)

After a general discussion, it was decided by the Committee that this bill should be amended to the following:

Senator Gibson -- Amend and Do Pass:

1) None of the money generated from this increase shall be used to increase the number of authorized patrolmen, the authorized amount being 151.

### SB 302 (See attached bill)

Mr. Howard Barrett said that there is no point in budgeting funds for Out-of-State for each one position, so the University uses operating funds under In-State travel.

### SB 380 (See attached bill)

Senator Gibson - Hold In Committee Senator Monroe - 2nd Senator Raggio - "NO" Senator Walker - Absent Motion Carried.

#### AB 348 (See attached bill)

Senator Gibson - Do Pass Senator Brown - 2nd Senator Walker - Absent Motion Carried.

#### AB 211 (See attached bill)

Senator Lamb submitted a letter from the Washoe County Republican Central Committee by Chairman Dan Poggione to the record which read as follows:

"This written statement indicates firm opposition to <u>Ab 211</u> regarding a pay increase for state classified personnel.

Please include an expression of opposition voted by the members of the Washoe County Republican Central Committee in your committee considerations."

Senator Young said that he has some reservations on this bill, because with the merit increases included this can mean a 25% to 27% increase for some of the employees.

Senator Monroe said that he would like to go for a 15% increase, retroactive to January 1st, and give no Cost of Living Increase for the second year of the Biennium. Senator Lamb said that the second year amount may have to be negotiated. Senator Monroe did not agree to this.

Senator Raggio said that he agrees with Senator Young that there should be some concern on this increase because of the current economic increase today, however, he did not hear any effective rebuttal against the issue that State employees are not up to par with the public sector. Senator Lamb said that he has no argument

that the State is behind.

Senator Young felt that the 15% and 7% request would have a major impact on the economy of the State, especially since the entire national economy is in a deficit situation.

Senator Gibson said that this will be of imposing magnitude for the future of Nevada, as this will mean about \$60 million for the Biennium, and the Senator did not understand that the General Fund would be increasing at that rate. Senator Gibson felt that this will mean increased taxes for the State, and he would not endorse a tax increase of such proportions.

Schator Lamb said that for every one percent taken off this requested appropriation, this will mean a \$900,000 savings. Mr. Ron Sparks said that this includes the University salaries too.

Senator Lamb asked if the Committee would negotiate the second year increase.

Senator Young felt that it would be irresponsible for the Committee to pass this legislation and not consider the impact of such a bill on retirement. Mr. Barrett said that the State's contribution to retirement will be increased by one percent.

Senator Brown suggested that it be amended to 12% for the first year, and 4% for the second. Senator Brown said that the local governments are faced with increasing salaries and reducing the staff, or not giving any raises. Senator Brown said that by approving the budgets with their new positions, the Committee is in affect allowing for a growth increase.

Senator Walker said that he was inclined to hold any increase for the second year. Senator Young felt that it should be 12% and 4%. Senator Lamb said that he really wanted to go for 15% and 5%, but he would rather go with 15% and no cost-of-living increase, rather than the 12% and 4%. Senator Young said that the bill as it is now would be irresponsible to the taxpayers, as it would lead to a tax increase.

Senator Gibson said that two things bother him; the total cost, and that he still believes that State employment is on the whole more attractive than private. Senator Gibson said that he can understand helping the lower incomes, but on the whole it looks like the State is heading for an average salary of \$15,000, and it will be up to the taxpayers to support this. Senator Gibson said that he would go for Senator Monroe's approach.

Senator Young asked if there was any danger of using State money for unemployment compensation if the fund for this is

depleted. Mr. Barrett said that this fund is taken care of by federal loan money.

Senator Gibson said that the comparisons made between other governmental sub-divisions and the State aren't equitable because some of the comparisons discussed salaries for one city employee compared to forty State employees. Senator Gibson said that 12% and 4% would be practical, but the 15% and no increase for the second year would be wiser politically.

Mr. Howard Barrett gave the following revenue projections for the State to show the growth for the Biennium:

1975-76 -- Gaming Tax = 12% Sales Tax = 4%

1976-77 -- Gaming Tax = 12% Sales Tax = 9%

Senator Gibson said that the combined average is about 8%, and perhaps it would be advisable to install some sort of trigger device so that the cost-of-living increase could go to 7% if the General Fund growth allowed for this. Senator Gibson said that it could be 12% for the first year, and 4% for the second year with the leverage to increase to 7% if the General Fund increased by 3%. Mr. Barrett said that the Administration is adamant about the 15% for the first year.

Senator Monroe - Amend and Do Pass for 15% for the first year, retroactive; and no increase for the second year.

Senator Walker - 2nd

Senator Young - Amend the motion to 12% for the first year retroactive, and 4% for the second year. . . No second received.

Senator Raggio asked what the average salary classified is now for the state Mr. Sparks said that the average for all employees is \$925.44 per month. Senator Raggio stated that he would like to know the average of just the classified alone. Senator Raggio submitted an example of what this increase will mean for a salary of \$1,000 per month:

Senator Raggio wanted to know the number of employees below the \$10,000 level. Mr. Sparks said that there are 3,639 classified employees below the \$10,000 per year, and 3,476 above the \$10,000 level.

The Chairman called a vote on the original motion by Senator Monroe.

# SENATE BILL NO. 336—COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

March 13, 1975

#### Referred to Committee on Finance

SUMMARY—Revises Public Employees' Retirement Act. Fiscal Note: Yes. (BDR 23-185)



EXPLANATION—Matter in italics is new; matter in brackets [ ] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public employees' retirement; creating a separate police and firemen's retirement fund; increasing certain contribution rates; permitting public employers to pay employees' contributions to the public employees' retirement fund; restricting employees' right to withdraw their contributions to the retirement fund; increasing post-retirement allowances; providing annual cost-of-living increases; abolishing certain benefits; increasing certain survivor benefits; removing outside employment restrictions on the executive officer; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 286 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 10, inclusive, of this act. SEC. 2. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 286.020 to 286.100, inclusive, and in sections 3 to 10, inclusive, of this act, have the meanings ascribed to them in such sections.

SEC. 3. "Actuarial computation" means the computation based on benefits earned and life expectancy of member and beneficiary to determine necessary reduction of benefits under retirement options or to determine cost of purchasing additional benefits as provided in this chapter.

SEC. 4. "Compensation" is the gross salary paid to a member including payments for leave, overtime and longevity, and bonuses. The term does not include earnings paid for accumulated leave after:

1. The member has terminated his service and applied for a retirement allowance pursuant to the provisions of this chapter; or

2. The death of the member.

SEC. 5. "Disability retirement allowance" means monthly payments from the public employees' retirement fund paid to disabled members.

SEC. 6. 1. "Fireman" means a member who is a full-time employee of a participating public employer, whose principal duties are controlling and extinguishing fires and who is employed as:

2. The director shall appoint such additional patrolmen as soon after the beginning of each fiscal year as he can determine the amount of moneys which are available for this purpose. Salaries, travel and subsistence payments shall be as provided in NRS 481.170.

SEC. 2. NRS 482.480 is hereby amended to read as follows:

482.480 There shall be paid to the department for the registration or transfer of registration of motor vehicles, trailers and semitrailers, fees according to the following schedule:

1. For each stock passenger car, bus and each reconstructed or specially constructed passenger car, regardless of weight or number of passenger capacity, a registration fee of \$5.50.

AN ACT relating to the University of Nevada System; limiting per diem expense allowances for officers and employees thereof for travel to adjacent states; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 396 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section which shall read as follows:

1. Officers and employees of the University of Nevada System are entitled to receive travel expenses and subsistence allowances as provided in NRS 281.160 while engaged in official business, except that for travel to the states of California, Arizona, Utah, Idaho and Oregon the per diem expense allowance shall not exceed the maximum amount designated in such section for travel within the State of Nevada.

2. Per diem expense for travel in the state enumerated in this section shall be charged against in-state travel accounts, rather than out-of-state

travel accounts.

SECTION 1. Section 6 of the above-entitled act, being chapter 680, Statutes of Nevada 1973, at page 1262, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 6. 1. The board, on the behalf and in the name of the university, is authorized by this act, as supplemented by the provisions of the University Securities Law:

(a) To construct and otherwise acquire an addition to, and otherwise to improve, the Jot Travis Student Union Building on the University of Nevada, Reno, campus, in an amount not exceeding \$2,230,000;

(b) To issue bonds and other securities of the university, in a total principal amount of not exceeding \$2,030,000 in one series or more at any time or from time to time but not after 5 years from the effective date of this act, as the board may determine, and consisting of special obligations of the university payable from the net pledged revenues, secured by a pledge thereof and a lien thereon, subject to existing contractual limitations, for the purpose of defraying wholly or in part the cost

AN ACT relating to University of Nevada System; authorizing certain exemptions from the registration fee for veterans attending the University of Nevada; relating amount of exemption to disability; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 396 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 5, inclusive, of this act.

SEC. 2. As used in sections 3 to 5, inclusive, of this act, unless the context requires otherwise:

1. "Bona fide resident" means a person whose residence is determined in accordance with NRS 10.020.

2. "Registration fee" means a fee, excluding room, board, book and tuition charge, assessed upon registration against students who are Nevada residents.

3. "Veteran" means any person who has served at least 90 consecutive days of active duty, excluding duty for training purposes, in any branch of military service of the United States, and who has been granted a discharge under honorable conditions or a certificate of satisfactory service therefor.

SEC. 3. Any veteran who, as a bona fide resident of Nevada, enrolls as a full-time student at any campus within the University of Nevada System may request exemption from the payment of the assessed registration fee to the extent of:

1. One hundred percent if he:

(a) Has a 70 percent service-connected disability; or

(b) Is totally disabled, irrespective of the service connection of the disability.

2. Fifty percent if he does not meet the requirements of subsection 1. SEC. 4. Any request for exemption must be made upon registration

AN ACT relating to the University of Nevada, Las Vegas; authorizing the board of regents to agree to lease or lease to the Federal Government facilities to be acquired at the university; authorizing the issuance and sale of securities in accordance with the act and with the University Securities Law to pay for such acquisition; providing for the payment of the securities, operation and maintenance expenses and ground rent; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

# The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Except as otherwise provided in this act, terms used or referred to in this act are as defined in the University Securities Law; but the following terms whenever used or referred to in this act and in the University Securities Law in its connection with this act, unless the context otherwise requires, have the meanings ascribed to them in sections 2 and 3 of this act.

SEC. 2. "Net pledged revenues" means all the net revenues to be derived under the terms of the agreement or lease executed pursuant to section 4 of this act, or from other available sources, and to which the pledge and lien provided for payment of the securities authorized in this act are extended.

SEC. 3. "Project" means the construction, other acquisition and improvement (or any combination thereof) of the buildings, structures and other facilities required or desired by the university on the campus of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, as delineated and described in section 5 of this act, equipment and furnishings therefor, and other appurtenances relating thereto.

SEC. 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of NRS 396.430, and without the consent of the governor, the board of regents of the University of Nevada is authorized to execute an agreement to make a lease or execute

The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 1. Except as otherwise provided in this act, to effect an approximate 15-percent salary increase effective January 1, 1975, there is hereby appropriated from the general fund in the state treasury, for the fiscal period January 1, 1975, to June 30, 1975, the sum of \$2,050,088 and for the fiscal periods July 1, 1975, to June 30, 1976, and from July 1, 1976, to June 30, 1977, the sums of \$4,395,035 and \$4,548,576, respectively, to the state board of examiners for the purpose of meeting any deficiencies which may be created between appropriated funds of the respective departments, commissions and agencies of the State of Nevada as fixed by the 57th session of the legislature and the salary requirements of classified personnel of such departments, commissions and agencies necessary under an adjusted pay plan, except those employees whose salaries have been retained, to become effective on January 1, 1975.
