

## SENATE BILL NO. 117—COMMITTEE ON ENVIRONMENT AND PUBLIC RESOURCES

### **JANUARY 30, 1975**

#### Referred to Committee on Environment and Public Resources

SUMMARY—Reduces residence requirement for persons over 65 years of age to qualify for reduced hunting and fishing license fee. Fiscal Note: Yes. (BDR 45-136)

EXPLANATION—Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets [ ] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to hunting and fishing licenses; revising requirements for licenses for certain senior citizens; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

### The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. NRS 502.240 is hereby amended to read as follows:

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502.240 Annual licenses [for the term of 1 year from July 1 to June 30] and limited permits shall be issued at the following prices:

1. To any citizen of the United States who has attained his 12th birthday but who has not attained his 16th birthday and who has been a bona fide resident of the State of Nevada for 6 months, upon the payment of 1 for an annual fishing or hunting license.

2. To any citizen of the United States who has attained his 65th birthday and who has been a bona fide resident of the State of Nevada for 20 years, upon the payment of \$1 for an annual hunting or fishing license. Any such person shall be exempt from the payment of the fee for a resident deer tag for a regular season as required by the provisions of NRS 502.250.

14 3.] Except as provided in [subsection 2,] section 2 of this act, to 15 any citizen of the United States who has attained his 16th birthday and 16 who has been a resident of the State of Nevada for 6 months, upon the 17 payment of:

For a fishing license	\$7.50
For a 5-day permit to fish	5.00
For a 2-day permit to fish	3.00
For a hunting license	7.50
For a combination hunting and fishing license	14.00
For a trapping license	5.00
For a fur dealer's license	1.00
For an annual master guide's license	50.00
For an annual subguide's license	10.00

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
