MINUTES OF MEETING

MARCH 14, 1975

The meeting was called to order at 9:25 a.m. Senator Close was in the Chair.

ABSENT: Senator Sheerin

<u>SJR 14</u> Proposes constitutional amendment to eliminate certain restrictions on the right to seek elective office.

> Senator Dodge moved a "do pass", Senator Bryan seconded the motion, Motion carried unanimously. Senators Foote, Sheerin and Wilson were absent from the vote.

<u>SB 329</u> Revises provisions relating to civil causes of action for seduction.

> Senator Close stated that NRS 12.070 could not be eliminated in that the parents of a minor child are the ones that must file suit. Senator Bryan will research the bill and report back to the Committee.

There was no action taken at this time.

<u>SB 319</u> Requires and provides for interpreters for certain handicapped persons in civil and criminal proceedings.

Discussion was resumed from the March 13, 1975 meeting on Section 10. Mr. Frank Daykin was called in to discuss the amendments with the Committee. The following amendments were made:

NRS 18.010 will be amended to include "reasonable fees for an interpreter not to excede \$250 unless specifically allowed by the court."

Delete lines 9 through 11 on Page 2.

Amend Section 10 to comply with Section 9 and the new Section 10 (as drafted March 13, 1975).

Delete Sections 11 and 12.

Mr. Daykin will redraft the bill with the amendments. SB 319 There was no action taken at this time.

Eliminates certain legal disparities based on sex. SB 320

> Senator Close recommended omitting Section 1 as it is being incorporated into a package of bill referring to this. Senator Foote will contact the Washoe County Sheriff in regard to NRS 199.420 (relating to posse comitatus) and report back to the Committee.

No action was taken at this time.

Senator Close informed the Committee that he has received requests for the introduction of the following items:

A bill amending NRS 706.151 relating to motor carriers.

A bill which would place the Clark County Sheriff and the District Attorney back on the Clark County Liquor and Gaming Licensing Board.

The introductions were approved unanimously.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
