ACTION WAS THEN TAKEN ON THE FOLLOWING BILLS:

AB 215 Expands definition of "peace officer" to include security officers working for the legislature of the State of Nevada; and providing other matters properly related thereto.*

AB 1 Repeals provisions relating to prefiling of legislative bills and resolutions. *

Assemblyman Keith Ashworth testified as to the purpose of the bill, relating that he felt that in the interest of time at the beginning of each session, it was necessary to have as many bills as possible preprinted, but that they should not contain referral, committee assignment and number.

Senator Young disagreed feeling that it would save a lot more time if they could contain referal, committee assignment and number.

After further discussion:

Senator Gibson moved "DO PASS".
Senator Brown seconded the motion.
Motion carried unanimously.

AN ACT relating to peace officers; expanding the definition of "peace officer" to include security officers working for the legislature of the State of Nevada; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. NRS 169.125 is hereby amended to read as follows:

169.125 "Peace officer" includes: The bailiff of the supreme court;

Sheriffs of counties and of metropolitan police departments and their deputies;

AN ACT relating to the state legislature; repealing provisions relating to the prefiling of legislative bills and resolutions; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. NRS 218.280 is hereby amended to read as follows: 218.280 [Except as provided in NRS 218.277 to 218.279, inclusive, all] All bills and resolutions shall be introduced in triplicate; and one copy of each bill or resolution shall be marked "original," one shall be marked "duplicate," and one shall be marked "triplicate." The copy marked "duplicate" shall be sent to the superintendent of the state printing and records division of the department of general services for the purpose of printing, and the copy marked "triplicate" shall be referred to the legislative counsel.

Sec. 2. NRS 218.277, 218.278 and 218.279 are hereby repealed.
