ACTION WAS TAKEN ON THE FOLLOWING BILLS:

SCR 58 Requests Governor to appoint salary study committee.

Senator Young moved "HOLD" to see what happens to a similiar bill. Seconded by Senator Young Motion carried unanimously.

ACR 44

Directs the legislative commission to study feasibility of establishing state home for veterans in Nevada.

Senator Gibson moved "HOLD" Seconded by Senator Brown Motion carried unanimously.

SB 608

Provides for typesetting and printing of brochures and booklets by state printing and records division.

Senator Gibson moved "DO PASS" Seconded by Senator Young Motion carried unanimously.

SCR 48

Directs the legislative commission to appoint committee to study interrelation of regulations by health division of department of human resources and power of local governments to approve construction projects.

Jack Kenny stated he was opposed to single-purpose boards and wanted to see a study of the health department, as he felt it needs restructuring. Senators Gibson and Young took exception to some of the statements made by Mr. Kenny.

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Pros and cons were discussed, with the committee deciding to amend and strike all the words "whereas".

Senator Gibson moved "AMEND AND DO PASS" Seconded by Senator Young Motion carried unanimously.

SENATE BILL NO. 608—COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATIVE FUNCTIONS

May 8, 1975

Referred to Committee on Legislative Functions

SUMMARY—Provides for typesetting and printing of brochures and booklets by state printing and records division. Fiscal Note: No. (BDR 29-1885)



Explanation—Matter in *Italics* is new; matter in brackets [] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to state printing; providing for the typesetting and printing of brochures and booklets by the state printing and records division of the department of general services; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

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SECTION 1. NRS 344.150 is hereby amended to read as follows: 344.150 All officers, boards, commissioners, trustees, superintendents, regents and directors are required and directed to have all brochures, booklets, forms, blanks, envelopes and letterheads necessary for the successful working of the various departments, institutions and offices type-set and printed by the department. The superintendent is directed to accept all such work, and to execute and deliver it as promptly as possible.

SEC. 2. NRS 344.160 is hereby amended to read as follows: 344.160 1. Should any state officer, commissioner, trustee or superintendent consider that the requirements of his office, department or institution demand brochures, booklets, stationery, blanks, forms for work of any character, typesetting, printing or binding which cannot be performed in the division, and if it appear that, through lack of necessary machinery or appliances, the work cannot be done satisfactorily in the division. I the superintendent shall authorize the state officer, commissioner, trustee or superintendent to have the work performed in a commercial printing establishment, the cost of the same to be paid out of the contingent fund provided for the expenses of state officers or out of the fund provided for the support of the commission or institution requiring the work, as the case may be.


2. The state controller is directed not to draw his warrant in payment for any printed matter except such as is authorized by subsection 1.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the legislative commission to study and make recommendations relating to the impact of regulations by the health division of the department of human resources on the power of a local government to approve construction projects.

Resolved by the Senate of the State of Nevada, the Assembly concurring, That the legislative commission is directed to study:

The statutory requirements of chapters 116, 117, 278, 444 and 445 of NRS as they confer regulatory authority upon the health division of the department of human resources;

The effect of the health division's regulations on local government's

authority to approve or disapprove construction projects; and

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The feasibility of placing with local governments the exclusive control over the approval or disapproval of any construction project; and be. it further

Resolved, That the legislative commission report the results of the study and make appropriate recommendations to the 59th session of the legislature.
