COMMITTEE ACTION

SENATE BILL 503-Mr. Mann moved to AMEND AND SEND TO THE FLOOR WITHOUT RECOMMENDATION, seconded by Mr. May. The amendments are to be clerical and technical in nature only. Under discussion Mr. Craddock remarked as follows: I would be pleased to see the entire unincorporated area vote as a block for the following reasons: The way the taxes (alcohol, cigarette, and $\frac{1}{2}\text{¢}$ sales) are allocated to assist areas with a low property tax base would change and Sunrise Mannor and East Las Vegas would be unable to support the present level of services if they were to be separated from Paradise and Winchester. Secondly, if any of the unincorporated areas that require municipal services remain in the county, any savings that we may enjoy will, in a big part, be lost.

The motion to AMEND WITHOUT RECOMMENDATION passed 8-1 with Mr. Jeffrey voting no.

Mr. May then made a motion to have the COMMITTEE TAPES TURNED IN INTACT AND NOT ERASED OR ALTERED, seconded by Mr. Craddock, motion passed unanimously. This was a result of the committee's learning that the Senate Judiciary and Senate Finance committees had directed their secretaries to erase the tapes of the committee meetings. The Government Affairs Committee of the Assembly wanted to go on record as opposed to any such action.

SENATE BILL 166 - Mr. Mann moved to RESCIND THE ACTION WHEREBY THE COMMITTEE PASSED OUT S.B. 166, seconded by Mr. May, passed with Mr. Moody voting no.

SENATE BILL 157 - With the understanding that the subcommittee will have to go to conference committee with the Senate on this bill, Mr. May moved to AMEND AND DO PASS, seconded by Mr. Mann, motion passed unanimously. The amendment is attached as Exhibit 1. Chairman Murphy told the committee that according to the Legislative Counsel it is legal to change county salaries in the middle of the term.
