RULES

LABOR AND MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

59th SESSION

- 1. A quorum shall consist of at least four (4) members of the Committee.
- 2. A quorum is required to be present before the Committee may be called to order.
- 3. The secretary of the Committee shall call the roll at each meeting and record in the minutes the members present and the members absent. Excused absences will be so recorded.
- 4. "Ma'son's" Manual will be followed as to parliamentary procedure.
- 5. When the Chairman is not present the Vice Chairman shall conduct the meeting.
- 6. The Committee members shall address the chair at all times for permission to be heard or to question a witness.
- 7. Final voting action by the Committee will not be carried out until all witnesses have been heard, questioned, and dismissed.
- 8. Passage or defeat of a motion will require a majority vote of the entire Committee.
- 9. All definite actions taken on bills or resolutions shall be by roll call vote and the results shall be recorded by the secretary.
- 10. Any member may file a minority report with the Chief Clerk at the same time as the Committee actions are reported.
- 11. An affirmative vote of five (5) members of the Committee is required in order to reconsider any action previously taken on a bill.
- 12. Committee bill introduction shall be by an affirmative vote of four (4) members present at a regular meeting. Committee introduction does not imply that any member is committed to support the bill.
