Chairman Glover called the meeting to order at 4:20 p.m. Mr. Glover asked for a motion to suspend rule 91 since it was getting late in the session. Mr. Bennett so moved, seconded by Mr. Coulter and unanimously carried by the committee. He then asked that testifiers please keep their remarks brief as time was of the essence.

<u>ACR 52:</u> Directs legislative commission to conduct a study of administration practices of Nevada Industrial Commission and alternative methods of providing workmen's compensation coverage.

Joe Midmore, representing the Nevada Independent Insurance Agents, stated that he had been asked to speak for the Nevada Home Builder's Association also, which represents the housing industry in both Northern and Southern Nevada. He stated that his organization had asked for this resolution to have the state's workmen's compensation system studied by the legislative commission. He added that because workmen's compensation is such a controversial subject with an unending need for corrective measures, a total review is necessary. He explained that they felt the study should include methods of determining risks, actuarial matters and the rate system of Nevada. He added that they were not asking for any lowering of benefits or rates but felt the study should include expert consultants from outside the state to provide technical assistance. He asked that the committee recommend the adoption of this resolution by the Assembly. Mrs. Wagner asked if <u>ACR 52</u> covered everything that was included in as similar resolution, <u>ACR 19</u>. Mr. Midmore stated that it did indeed cover everything and also provided for independent expert consultants which they felt was very necessary. Mrs. Wagner then asked if the emphasis of this study was on insurance or an investigation of the NIC. Mr. Midmore answered that it is an investigation of the entire workmen's compensation process.

<u>ACR 39</u>: Directs legislative commission to study feasibility of changing boundaries or creating new county for southern portion of Nye County.

William Kissam, Assemblyman District #4, stated that he was seeking a study of the Pahrump Valley, Amargosa Valley, Lathrop, Wells areas to find out if a problem actually exists as he thinks it does. He added that he had been asked by many residents and land owners to request this study, that as a land owner and developer in this area he feels there is a taxpayer's revolt. He stated that he had received a great deal of publicity, that he was representing himself and many of his clients who had an increase in assessed valuation of 96% and felt they were paying an unfair share of taxes without proper services. He added that the opposition felt he was not a registered voter or resident of this area and should not be representing them but he felt that, because he owned over a million dollars worth of land in the area and had many clients there, he was justified in finding out if a problem did exist. He explained that any suggestions made by this study would have to be voted on by the people, and they should have this opportunity.

Mr. Glover asked if the same thing could not be accomplished by a bill and Mr. Kissam explained this could have been done but he felt that the public should have a vote in this matter and a study would point out what would be best for the residents.

Mrs. Wagner asked if it might not be better handled at the local level without the direction of the legislative commission. Mr. Kissam explained that there are many splintered groups in this area and he feels it would be better to find the facts and ask the residents what they want. He added that many of the residents were small land owners and would not be financially able to conduct this kind of a study. He said that a seminar was to be held but it would be speakers speaking on their own subject and would not include feedback from the residents as to what they want.

Don Moody, Assemblyman District #36, stated that he opposed ACR 39, that he represented this district and no one had asked for this study. He added that he had contacted Senator Blakemore who also represented this district and no one had contacted him either. He stated that since the publicity concerning this resolution was in the newspapers, he had had many people contact him opposing it. He added that a study would cost money, and that he felt it would be money wasted.

Mrs. Wagner asked Mr. Moody why he was opposed to a study and he stated that 80 percent of the people were satisfied with things as they are now and had not requested their legislators to have study.

Jim Lien, Department of Taxation, stated that since there was an accusation concerning the assessed valuation stimulating some desire for removement from one county to another, he wanted to point out that the Nevada Tax Commission and the State Board of Equalization are basically responsbile for those increases. He added that two years ago when there was a reevaluation of Pahrump Valley, the Nevada Tax Commission found it not to be in line with other like properties and ordered a reappraisal. The State Board of Equalization reviewed that reappraisal this year and felt that the assessed valuations were proper for that type of a subdivision located in a rural area. He added that it would make no difference in what county it were located as it would still be the same type of property. The increase in evaluation is not Nye County's fault, but the fault of the state.

<u>ACR 42</u>: Directs legislative commission to study "no-fault" automobile insurance.

Mr. Kissam felt this study should be made to find out why there are so many complaints concerning no-fault insurance. Mr. Bremner stated that most of the complaints concerned premiums which included physical damage coverage also and suggested that the whole problem of automobile insurance be studied.

<u>ACR 8</u>: Directs legislative commission to study assessment and taxation of geothermal resources.

Jim Lien, Deputy Director of the Department of Taxation, stated that at the present time there are several geothermal leases in the state by major oil and power companies. He stated that the only taxation of these is the tax on the lease itself and not on anything which might be produced. He added that there are certain bills in the legislature now which would exempt tax on geothermal and other types of energy and resources, but there is a wide range of potential uses. He said that it was felt that the leases and uses should be studied to determine what the policy of the state will be concerning geothermal resources.

<u>ACR 40</u>: Directs legislative commission to study feasibility of creating commission to regulate transportation.

William Quinn stated that he was representing Assemblyman Karen Hayes as she was in another meeting. He stated that this bill grew out of legislation that Mrs. Hayes had introduced transferring some of the functions of the Public Service Commission to a separate, parallel commission. He added that in discussion of that bill points were raised that indicated this study would be helpful. Some of these points were overlapping between the Department of Motor Vehicles and the Public Service Commission, adequate regulation of air transport, problems of the smaller motor carriers. He said that it was felt that there might be a possibility of consolidating some of these activities or creating a new transportation division, and this should be studied along with the area of aircraft regulation.

Assembly

Mr. Glover asked how many studies had been done for the Department of Transportation and Mr. Quinn stated that he knew of none.

ACR 4: Directs legislative commission to conduct an interim study of the subject of early childhood development.

Mrs. Wagner stated that she felt the legislature had not been as concerned with the needs and problems of children as she felt they should. She said that she had done some research of other states and found they had done studies such as this. She added that there was duplication and overlapping by various agencies which could be replaced with needed services.

Shirley Wedow, member of the State Board of Education, said that the State Board of Education supported ACR 4 mainly because they had had trouble within their own board determining who was responsible for some education programs for preschool children. She added that they felt this study would clarify problems and duplications in programs for preschool children.

Mr. Glover asked Mrs. Wedow if the board anticipated taking part in this study and she replied that she was sure board members would be glad to participate and she would hope that the staff would be willing to help also.

ACR 54: Directs legislative commission to study structures and functions of state board of education and state department of education.

Mrs. Wedow stated that she felt that after what has happened to the State Board of Education and the Department of Education this session, this study would certainly be worthwhile in establishing credibility. She added that she had not discussed this legislation with the board and could only speak for herself.

Mr. Glover stated that the Ways and Means Committee had cut \$178,000 from their budget each year of the biennium and he felt this was due to a lack of credibility. Mrs. Wedow stated she did not know how many positions this would effect.

ACR 35: Direct legislative commission to study and develop rate structures for use by certain public utilities.

John Aramburu, representing Assemblyman Nancy Gomes, stated that the basic concern was the factors involved in the recent rate hikes and what can be done to counteract some of these factors. He added that the utilities said that the two major reasons for rising rates were rising fuel prices for gas and oil used both for heating and generating electricity and high financing costs. He explained that the traditional rate structure used in this country has been the declining block structure and under this system increased energy usage results in reduced per unit cost. He added that from a conservation standpoint, this was not a way to save energy, that excessive use must be penalized and that this system would also increase expansion needs which in turn would increase financial costs.

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He added that there are alternatives that need consideration such as the life-line block where higher rates are applied to usage above a certain level in each household or peak-load pricing where amounts of energy usage are decreased during peak periods which in turn reduces expansion needs. He also stated that these alternative rate structures are based on some economic or ecological justification whereas the current rate structures tend to penalize low income families and are detrimental to the economy. He explained that this might be considered a problem for the Public Service Commission but that they have had ample time to study this and seem content to leave it up to the utilities who are inherently interested in increased usage.

# <u>ACR 49</u>: Directs legislative commission to study feasibility of statewide salary schedule for public school teachers.

John Hawkins, Superintendent of Schools in Carson City, stated that he would like to support the testimony on <u>ACR 4</u>. He said that he had taught in both small and large schools in the state and felt there was merit in studying a uniform salary schedule for the state teachers as well as administrators. He added that he felt that there was dissatisfaction in some districts that could not afford to meet salary schedules of other schools and that medical and dental services in various areas should also be a consideration.

Mr. Murphy stated that a resolution was being drafted concerning the study of boards and commission in the state and the sunset concept which would be introduced and referred to this committee.

ACR 44: Directs legislative commission to study community college division of University of Nevada System.

In answer to Mrs. Wagner's question as to whether the money committees had made any decision on new locations, Mr. Glover said the committee had decided against the sites in West Charleston, Henderson and Fallon, but if this study were to decide these were needed they would not lose their priority.

Mr. Murphy asked how many studies were going to be allowed during the interim and Mr. Glover said it appeared that ten or twelve could be done without overburdening staff and within the budget.

ACR 38: Directs the legislative commission to study crimes and punishments.

Mrs. Wagner stated that one of the problems the Judiciary committee has had is a tremendous number of bills dealing with a change in punishment of crimes, double penalties, probation and parole. She added that many of these bills have been held because it was felt that there should be an entire overview and consolidation within NRS of the crime and punishment system in the state to make it equitable. AJR 50: Urges Congress to enact tax credit for employers of handicapped persons.

Mr. Bremner moved a DO PASS on <u>AJR 50</u> seconded by Mrs. Wagner and unanimously carried by the committee.

<u>ACR 15</u>: Directs legislative commission to study Nevada rules of criminal procedure compared with American Bar Association proposed standards of criminal justice.

Mrs. Wagner moved for an INDEFINITE POSTPONEMENT, seconded by Mr. Bremner and unanimously carried by the committee.

<u>ACR 14</u>: Directs legislative commission to study feasibility of conducting legislative review of existing and future regulations of agencies of executive branch of state government.

The committee decided to hold this bill for a future motion as they felt there were other bills which might pass dealing with the same subject.

<u>ACR 10</u>: Directs legislative commission to study feasiblity of establishing boundary commission.

Mr. Bremner asked it this resolution was a result of the trouble with California over boundaries and Mr. Murphy answered that it dealt with problems of special improvement districts. Mr. Bennett moved an INDEFINITE POSTPONEMENT, seconded by Mr. Murphy and unanimously carried by the committee.

ACR 29: Directs interim study of consolidation in urban counties.

Mr. Bennett moved an INDEFINITE POSTPONEMENT, but there was no second and the committee decided to hold the bill for a future vote.

ACR 37: Directs legislative commission to study and make recommendations relating to rerefining of waste oil.

Mr. Bremner moved an INDEFINITE POSTPONEMENT on <u>ACR 37</u>, seconded by Mr. Bennett. The motion was carried with Mr. Coulter voting no.

<u>ACR 19</u>: Directs legislative commission to study operation of Nevada Industrial Commission.

The committee felt that ACR 52 was a better bill dealing with the same subject. Mr. Bennett moved an INDEFINITE POSTPONEMENT on ACR 19, seconded by Mr. Bremner and unanimously carried by the committee.

ACR 47: Direct legislative commission to conduct study of juvenile court facilities in Clark County.

Mr. Bennett stated that Mr. Daykin would come to the next meeting and explain that this should be mental facilities rather than court facilities.

Directs legislative commission to conduct a study of adminis-ACR 52: tration practices of Nevada Industrial Commission and alternative methods of providing workmen's compensation coverage.

Mr. Coulter moved a DO PASS, seconded by Mr. Bennett and unanimously carried by the committee.

ACR 48: Directs legislative commission to study welfare programs administered by state.

Mrs. Wagner moved for an INDEFINITE POSTPONEMENT, seconded by Mr. Bennett and unanimously carried by the committee.

ACR 42: Directs legislative commission to study "no-fault" automobile insurance.

Mr. Bremner stated that increased rates were directly tied to factors other, than no-fault and he felt that all automobile insurance should be studied. The committee unanimously agreed to amend the bill by deleting the word "no-fault" from the entire bill. Mr. Bennett moved a DO PASS AS AMENDED, seconded by Mr. Murphy and carried unanimously carried by the committee.

ACR 39: Directs legislative commission to study feasibility of changing boundaries or creating new county for southern portion of Nye County.

Mr. Murphy moved an INDEFINITE POSTPONEMENT, seconded by Mr. Bennett. The motion was carried with Mr. Glover voting no.

Directs legislative commission to study assessment and taxa-ACR 8:tion of geothermal resources.

Mr. Bremner moved a DO PASS on ACR 8, seconded by Mr. Coulter and unanimously carried by the committee.

Directs legislative commission to study feasibility of ACR 40: creating commission to regulate transportation.

Mr. Glover stated that there had been some problems in the Transportation Committee which this study might help solve. Mr. Bremner stated vldmssrA

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that he had received inquiries as to the study of public transportation in the Las Vegas area and asked if this might be included in this study. Mr. Murphy and Mrs. Wagner agreed that this was needed in Reno also. The committee unanimously agreed to amend this resolution to include public transportation. Mr. Bremner moved a DO PASS AS AMENDED, seconded by Mr. Bennett and unanimously carried by the committee.

<u>ACR 54</u>: Directs legislative commission to study structures and function of state board of education and state department of education.

Mr. Bennett moved a DO PASS on <u>ACR 54</u>, seconded by Mr. Murphy and unanimously carried by the committee.

ACR 4: Directs the legislative commission to conduct an interim study of the subject of early childhood development.

Mr. Coulter moved a DO PASS, seconded by Mr. Murphy and unanimously carried by the committee.

ACR 38: Directs the legislative commission to study crimes and punishments.

Mr. Coulter moved a DO PASS, seconded by Mrs. Wagner and unanimously carried by the committee.

ACR 35: Directs legislative commission to study and develop rate structures for use by certain public utilities.

Mr. Coulter moved a DO PASS, seconded by Mr. Murphy and unanimously carried by the committee.

ACR 49: Directs legislative commission to study feasibility of statewide salary schedule for public school teachers.

Mr. Bennett moved an INDEFINITE POSTPONEMENT on <u>ACR 49</u>, seconded by Mr. Bremner and unanimously carried by the committee.

ACR 44: Directs legislative commission to study community college division of University of Nevada System.

Mrs. Wagner moved a DO PASS, seconded by Mr. Coulter and carried unanimously by the committee.

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ACR 34: Directs legislative commission to study extent of unclaimed property in Nevada.

Mr. Murphy moved a DO PASS, seconded by Mr. Bremner and unanimously carried by the committee.

<u>ACR 14</u>: Directs legislative commission to study feasibility of conducting legislative review of existing and future regulations of agencies of executive branch of state government.

The committee decided to hold this bill for a future vote.

ACR 29: Directs interim study of consolidation in urban counties.

Mr. Bennett moved for an INDEFINITE POSTPONEMENT, seconded by Mr. Bremner and unanimously carried by the committee.

ACR 5: Directs legislative commission to study feasibility of establishing state geriatric center.

Mr. Murphy stated that this came out of an interim study done last year and that very few universities in the country cover this area of study. He added it would be in conjunction with one of the university systems. Mr. Bennett moved a DO PASS, seconded by Mr. Murphy and unanimously carried by the committee.

<u>AB 458:</u> Requires assessment of each legislative bill to determine its effect upon administrative work.

The committee felt they still needed someone to be present to answer their questions on this bill and put off discussion until the next meeting.

ACR 55: Directs legislative commission to study administration of mental hygiene and mental retardation programs in Nevada.

Mr. Glover stated that this was a result of Mr. Kosinski's excellent subcommittee report for the Ways and Means Committee. Mr. Murphy moved for an INDEFINITE POSTPONEMENT, seconded by Mr. Bennett but the committee decided to discuss the bill at the next meeting when Mr. Kosinski could be present to answer questions.

Mr. Jacobsen stated that he thought this was one of the healthiest 167

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pieces of legislation and Mr. Bennett moved a DO PASS, seconded by Mr. Coulter and unanimously carried by the committee.

Mr. Glover asked everyone to try and be at the meeting on Wednesday promptly at 3:00 and added that he hoped the committee could meet with the Senate committee on Thursday to negotiate. He then adjourned the meeting at 5:05 p.m.
