- BDR 56-226 Creates special revenue funds for thrift company section and Credit Union Division of Department of Commerce.

- BDR 54-678 Changes composition of Nevada state board of accountancy.
Senator Ashworth moved for Committee introduction.

- BDR 57-483 Changes provisions concerning Nevada insurance guaranty association.
Senator Blakemore moved for Committee introduction.
Senator Bryan seconded the motion.

- BDR 54-337 Amends citizenship requirements for professional licenses to include persons legally entitled to work in United States.

BDR 43-287 Increases minimum limits of mandatory motor vehicle liability coverage.

After further discussion it was decided to hold BDR 57-321 and BDR 54-81.


Chairman Wilson stated there would be a short meeting on Monday, January 24, 1977, to dispose of BDR 57-321 and BDR 54-81.

COMMITTEE RULES - 59TH SESSION

COMMERCE AND LABOR

1. Four members constitute a quorum of the Committee.
2. Motions will be moved, seconded, and passed by a simple majority of those present, except that disposable action ("Do Pass" or "Hold") on a bill will require a majority of the entire Committee.
3. In order to reconsider previous action taken an affirmative vote of 5 members of the Committee will be required. However, a majority may allow the hearing of new evidence or information which would be pertinent to the determination of whether or not a matter or an action should be reconsidered.
4. Mason's Manual will be followed as to parliamentary procedure.
5. Any member of the Committee may request an item on the agenda by contacting the Committee Chairman a day ahead of the Committee meeting.
6. Committee bill introduction will be only by approval of five Committee members. Committee introduction does not imply in any way a commitment on the part of any Committee member to support the bill introduced.
7. No Committee action on bills or resolutions during a hearing.
8. Secretary shall record the action of the Committee by roll call vote.
9. Minority report can be filed with Secretary of the Senate at the same time the Committee action is reported. It must be signed by all members disagreeing who are present when the vote is taken. The members who desire to submit a minority report must so indicate in advance to the entire Committee.
10. Committee recesses. Recesses shall be at the call of the Chair.
