Assemblyman Jack Vergiels said that because of the many "heated" issues facing the school districts, the Boards requested that they be allowed to meet four (4) times per year, with compensation.

Senator Neal questioned the differentiation in salary between the President, Clerk and Trustee members. Assemblyman Vergiels said that the Clerk and President do more work. Senator Neal felt the salaries should be even as all of the members are elected.

Senator Raggio noted that this bill will not have to be re-referred to Finance as it is only a local government impact. Assemblyman Vergiels said that the money committees have been making all board salaries \$40.00/day, across the board.

Mr. Robert Best said that the President does do a great deal of work, and in the small counties the Clerk also is required to do a lot of the secretarial duties, so he has always accepted the differentiation.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 709—COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

APRIL 13, 1977

Referred to Committee on Ways and Means

SUMMARY—Allows clerk and president of board of trustees of certain school districts to receive compensation for additional meetings. (BDR 34-1827)

AN ACT relating to education; allowing the clerk and the president of the board of trustees of certain school districts to receive compensation for additional meetings; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. NRS 386.320 is hereby amended to read as follows: 386.320 1. If the average daily attendance of pupils between the ages of 6 years and 17 years attending school in the school district for the immediately preceding school year is less than 1,000:

(a) The clerk and president of the board of trustees may each receive a salary of \$20 for each board of trustees meeting they attend, not to exceed \$40 a month.

(b) The other trustees may each receive a salary of \$15 for each board of trustees meeting they attend, not to exceed \$30 a month.

(c) The board of trustees may hire a stenographer to take the minutes of the meetings of the board of trustees, and such stenographer may be paid [\$10] a reasonable fee for each meeting attended.

2. If the average daily attendance of pupils between the ages of 6 years and 17 years attending school in the school district for the immediately preceding school year is 1,000 or more:

(a) The clerk and president of the board of trustees may each receive a salary of \$40 for each board of trustees meeting they attend, not to exceed [\$80] \$160 a month.

(b) The other trustees may each receive a salary of \$35 for each board of trustees meeting they attend, not to exceed \$70 \$140 a month.

(c) The board of trustees may hire a stenographer to take the minutes of the meetings of the board of trustees; and such stenographer may be paid \$20 a reasonable fee for each meeting attended.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 495—ASSEMBLYMEN CHANEY AND BENNETT

MARCH 21, 1977

Referred to Committee on Education

SUMMARY—Requires that courses in family planning be given at certain levels in public schools and requires establishment of family planning centers at high schools. (BDR 34-1224)

The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 389 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section which shall read as follows:

1. Instruction concerning the prevention of venereal diseases and methods of birth control may be included in the curriculum of all public high schools of this state.

2. Such instruction shall not be given to any pupil whose parent or guardian submits written notice that the pupil is not to receive instruction concerning the prevention of venereal disease or methods of birth control.
