UNANIMOUS ACTION WAS TAKEN on the following BDR's which were referred by the Sub Committee on Complex Sources to this Committee for Committee introduction:

BDR 40-86 An act relating to air pollution and control.

BDR 40-85 An act relating to cemeteries requiring certain local government agencies to enforce regulations pertaining to construction of specified structures.

BDR 22-84 An act relating to the division of land revising provision of NRS respecting to review of proposed sub-divisions by certain state and local government agencies requiring courts to consider zoning requirments in certain proceedings.

Chairman Sheerin instructed members to provide the secretary with names to be notified of any committee meetings and hearings at which time bills relating to the interested party or parties will be acted upon.

The next meeting will be held on Monday, January 24, 1977, at 1:30 p.m.

COMMITTEE RULES - 59TH SESSION

ENVIRONMENT, PUBLIC RESOURCES and AGRICULTURE

- 1. Four members constitute a quorum of the committee.
- 2. Motions will be moved, seconded, and passed by a simple majority of those present, except that disposable action ("Do Pass" or "Hold") on a bill will require a majority of the entire committee.
- 3. In order to reconsider previous action taken, an affirmative vote of four members of the committee will be required. A majority of the entire committee may allow the hearing of new evidence or information which would be pertinent to the determination of whether or not a matter or an action should be reconsidered.
- 4. Mason's Manual will be followed as to parlimentary procedure.
- 5. Any member of the committee may request an item on the agenda by contacting the committee chairman a day ahead of the committee meeting.
- 6. Committee bill introduction will be only by unanimous approval of the committee. Committee introduction does not imply in any way a commitment on the part of any committee member to support the bill introduced.
- 7. Motions for disposable action by the committee will be taken only at the call of the chairman or in accordance with Rule 5 above. Such votes will be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.
- 8. A majority of the entire committee means four members.
- 9. Every member voting for a minority report must sign the report individually.
