SENATE BILL 279

Provides for receivership for gaming establishments in certain cases.

Chairman Hayes said that the Assembly Committee members that would serve on the subcommittee regarding this bill were herself, Mr. Stewart, and Mr. Prengaman.

ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 17

Requests Congress to call a convention limited to proposing amendment to Constitution to restrict abortion.

Chairman Hayes announced that the hearing date for this resolution had been changed from April 8 to April 1 with the time and location for the hearing remaining the same as previously scheduled. The Committee also discussed travel arrangements for getting to Las Vegas.

ASSEMBLY BILL 277

Changes certain fees of constables.

Mr. Stewart moved to Do Pass as Amended; Mr. Prengaman seconded the motion. The Committee approved the motion on the following vote:

Nay - Horn - 1.

ASSEMBLY BILL 146

Consolidates and clarifies certain provisions  
relating to comparative negligence.

Mr. Malone moved to Do Pass; Mr. Stewart seconded the motion.
