## ASSEMBLY BILL 524

Limits dissemination of certain criminal records and provides for their examination and challenge.

Steve Coulter stated that he had previously outlined the bill and its amendments. These amendments would still allow the press to disseminate Criminal History Record Information.

# SENATE BILL 500

Provides for appointment, powers and duties of supervisor for gaming establishment of its license if lapsed, revoked or suspended.

Jack Stratton, Gaming Control Board, and Bill Crowell, Attorney General's Office, were present to answer any questions on this bill. At present, the committee had no questions.

## SENATE BILL 559

Authorizes transfer of alien prisoners to their native country in certain circumstances.

Mike Medema, Department of Prisons, testified for this bill. He stated that it would permit them to transfer prisoners outside the continental United States. This would allow prisoners to serve time in their own native country.

Nash Sena questioned as to whether our country and another country could exchange prisoners.

Mr. Medema stated that, yes, it would be possible.

Warden Wolff, Department of Prisons, testified for this bill. He stated that the sentence being served would have to be strictly adhered to in the other country. The State that he is sent from would not have to see the prisoner to parole him. The decision of paroling the prisoner would be up to the original state of jurisdiction.

Paul Prengaman questioned as to whether the prisoner would have any say in the transfer.

Warden Wolff answered that the decision to be transferred would be totally up to the prisoner. In other words he would have to request it.

Chairman Hayes adjourned the meeting at 10:37 a.m.
