Chairman Gibson called the second meeting of the Government Affairs Committee to order at 1:30 p.m. The purpose of the meeting was to review some legislation for committee introduction and to consider some emergency legislation regarding the Washoe County School bonds.

Chairman Gibson informed the committee that the bonds were scheduled to go on sale Tuesday, January 23rd but due to an error the necessary legislation must be corrected and signed by the Governor. The committee was informed that according to Mr. Daykin the bill would be ready this evening and could possibly be signed by the Governor on Thursday in the morning.

Motion to introduce and treat as an emergency measure by Senator Raggio, seconded by Senator Echols. Motion carried unanimously.

The following were discussed by the committee and considered for committee introduction:

BDR-35-441^{*} - An act that was in reference to establishing fees for those using park facilities that would cover costs.

BDR-24-121^{**} - An act requested by Mr. Bill Swackhammer that would clarify various changes necessary in the election laws.

BDR-24-718[†] - An act also requested by Mr. Swackhammer clarifying existing procedures for transferring registration for voting.

BDR-24-204^{††} - An act clarifying requirements on campaign and expense reports.

BDR-24-770[°] - An act referring to the payment for the President's Preference Election Statutory Contingency fund.

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BDR-24-413^{*} - An act to provide necessary funds and authority to purchase punch card voting machines by the Secretary of State.

S-335^{**} - An act requested by the El Dorado Valley Land group to make necessary name changes to the Colorado River Resources as well as to allow for an extension of time to the State in order to buy necessary lands.


BDR-20-652 - An act that affects NRS-244 to remove the Sheriff from the Liquor Board license requirements in certain counties.

In addition to the above there were two housekeeping bills submitted by the Legislative Audit division. These bills would make minor error corrections and language clarification.

Motion on the preceeding for committee introduction was made by Senator Dodge, seconded by Senator Ford. Motion carried unanimously.


With no further business the meeting was adjourned at 1:50 p.m.
