Chairman Gibson called the fourth meeting of the Government Affairs Committee to order at 2:00 p.m. The first order of business was discussion of SB-12.

SB-12

Provides exception to limitation of one salary for all services rendered by public officers and employees.

Senator Raggio was asked by Chairman Gibson to begin the discussion on <u>SB-12</u>. Senator Raggio explained to the committee that at the time the bill was introduced it was brought to his attention that the University has had some difficulty in contracting teachers for their evening classes. The institutions are precluded from hiring individuals with special teaching skills that hold a public office as they are unable to pay them a salary.

This bill serves only to make an exemption in situations where those individuals who wish to teach a specialty class in the evening are public officers or employees. Senator Raggio then asked Judge Thompson and Dr. Baepler to testify further on this bill.

Judge Thompson, Las Vegas District Judge in District 1, testified in favor of <u>SB-12</u>. He concurred with Senator Raggio's testimony and stated that it came to his attention that the university system was in technical violation of NRS 281.127. He further urged the legislature to pass the bill in order to keep the university system in compliance with the statutes and enable the various public employees and officers to continue teaching such specialty classes.

Senator Dodge wanted to be sure that the bill would be worded so that there could not be any "double dipping" on the part of those public officials and employees that might wish to teach in the university system.

Judge Thompson stated that the bill could be worded so that this would not occur and that he would be in favor of such language.

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Dr. Baepler, Chancellor of the University of Nevada system, testified to the committee in favor of <u>SB-12</u>, stating that on behalf of the community colleges and university system they are in full support of passage of <u>SB-12</u>. Dr. Baepler felt that those individuals that taught in the evening classes contributed a great service and were not being compensated for their time and effort. He concurred with testimony given by Senator Raggio and Judge Thompson. Dr. Baepler further stated that they have been in violation of this statute (NRS 281.127) for a long time and wish to correct the situation.

Senator Ashworth questioned the language in subsection 2 under Section 1, lines 10 and 11. The Senator felt that the language as written would preclude a teacher from teaching at night. He stated that the language should be changed if they want to allow teachers to participate in this program.

Dr. Baepler agreed and would like to have the wording changed so that they would be not be precluded.

Senator Ford and Senator Raggio suggested various changes to the wording on lines 11 and 12 and Chairman Gibson suggested that Senator Raggio check with the counsel bureau and come up with the wording that was necessary and in compliance with the committee's wishes. Dr. Baepler and Judge Thompson were in favor of the changes suggested by the committee.

Senator Dodge moved to "Amend and Do Pass" <u>SB-12</u>. Senator Ford seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (Note: The bill is to be returned to the committee for review prior to going to the Senate floor)

SB-40

Provides for payment of costs of presidential preference primary elections from reserve for statutory contingency fund.

Secretary of State, William Swackhammer, testified to the committee in favor of <u>SB-40</u>. He stated that the cost of having a presidential preference primary would come out of the statutory contingency fund rather than the funds of our office. The dollar costs would be exactly the same to the state, its just a matter of budgeting. Mr. Swackhammer continued by stating that the cost of the last such election cost the State \$166,000. He further added that when estimating the cost he was about 100% off and it caused problems in their budget.

Senator Dodge questioned whether there should be a presidential preference primary election and Mr. Swackhammer responded by stating that he was in favor of it for a couple of reasons. One being that it got the candidates to the west coast area and was well received by the public. Another reason for having at least one more presidential primary was that voter turnout increased.

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Senator Ashworth moved that $\underline{SB-40}$ be passed out of Committee with a "Do Pass". Senator Ford seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. This bill will be re-referred to Finance.

SB-41

Authorizes state to purchase punchcard vote recording devices and lease them to counties.

Secretary of State Swackhammer testified in favor of <u>SB-41</u> also. He informed the committee that it was their hope to have all the counties uniform in the punchcard system of voting. He felt that it was much faster and would be more economical in the long run. Mr. Swackhammer stated that the following counties do not have the punchcard system. They are as follows: Eureka, Lander, Humboldt, Pershing, Storey, Mineral, Esmeralda, Nye and Lincoln.

Mr. Swackhammer estimated that \$230,000. was the amount necessary to buy the equipment for these counties. He also felt that in the counties that have a small budget the State could work out a payment plan that they could afford. In response to questions by the committee Mr. Swackhammer stated that the cost for counting devices would be approximately \$1,900 for each county.

The committee questioned the language in Section 3, page 1 regarding the requirement for a separate lease agreement for each item purchased by a particular county.

Mr. Swackhammer anticipated this problem and suggested that the language on Line 18, page 1 beginning "A county, and ending at the end of that sentence on line 19 "agreement" be deleted. He also suggested that on line 21 that "is" be changed to "are".

The committee discussed and agreed upon the following changes to SB-41: On line 8, page 1, delete language after "legislature." Language would be deleted from that point on down through line 15. Throughout the bill the word "device" would be changed to "devices" On Page 2, the following changes were made to SB-41: Deletion of language after "agreements." on line 14 through line 24.

David Howard, assistant in the Secretary of State's office spoke to the committee on behalf of <u>SB-41</u> and concurred with the above mentioned changes. Mr. Howard felt that we would need 32 counting devices in order for the state to be uniform in the punchcard system. He further added that if the entire state were on the punchcard system they could purchase the paper from IBM at bulk rate costs and reduce the costs even more.

Senator Dodge moved that <u>SB-41</u> be "Amended" and passed out of committee with a "Do Pass" and re-referred to Finance. Seconded by Senator Ashworth. Motion carried unanimously.

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SB-62

Authorizes appointment of assistant secretary of state.

Secretary of State Swackhammer testified to the committee the reasons that he feels that this bill should be passed. There are two deputies within the Secretary of State's office and he feels it will more clearly define the duties of the deputy that is his assistant if he is called Assistant Secretary of State. The other deputies duties are to manage the office and it would clarify office procedures to have a name distinction between the two positions.

Senator Raggio moved that $\underline{SB-62}$ be passed out of Committee with a "Do Pass". Seconded by Senator Ashworth. Motion carried unanimously.

The following bills were requested by the Legislative Audit Division.

SB-43

Requires approval and review of certain accounts maintained by state agencies.

John Crossley, Legislative Auditor, testified in favor of <u>SB-43</u> to the committee and Mr. Lee Hansen, Audit Manager passed out some information to the committee. (See <u>Attachment 1</u>)

Mr. Crossley went over the attachment and also the bill, explaining the reason for the necessary changes. Mr. Crossley stated that he felt it would give the State a better control over bank accounts and in this way keep the legislature as well as the public informed on the various state agencies.

There was considerable discussion by the committee on this issue and it was felt that there should be tight controls on bank accounts.

Senator Raggio moved that <u>SB-43</u> be passed out of Committee with a "Do Pass". Seconded by Senator Dodge. Motion carried unanimously.

SB-44 Changes designation of certain funds.

Mr. Lee Hansen, Audit Manager, testified to the committee in favor of <u>SB-44</u> stating that these funds should be combined and Mr. Barrett was also in favor of this measure.

Senator Raggio moved that <u>SB-44</u> be passed out of Committee with a "Do Pass", seconded by Senator Echols. Motion carried unanimously.

At this point Chairman Gibson asked that the committee consider the following to be introduced as committee measures.

Senate Committee on GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

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BDR 24-115 (SB 128)

Prescribes procedure for nomination of independent presidential candidates.

Senator Ashworth moved that BDR-24-115 be introduced as a committee bill, seconded by Senator Dodge. Motion carried unanimously.

BDR-25-306 (SB 127)

This is an amendment to the Housing Act.

Senator Echols moved that BDR-25-306 be introduced as a committee bill, seconded by Senator Ford. Motion carried unanimously.

With no further business the meeting was adjourned at 3:55 p.m.
