## ASSEMBLY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 46—COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

MAY 3, 1979

Referred to Committee on Legislative Functions

SUMMARY—Directs legislative commission to study water problems in the state.
(BDR 1960)



EXPLANATION—Matter in italics is new; matter in brackets [ ] is material to be omitted.

ASSEMBLY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the legislative commission to study water problems and priorities for water usage in the state.

WHEREAS, Most of the land in Nevada is climatically a desert, a condition which has historically presented water problems for its residents; and

Whereas, The growth of population in certain areas of the state threatens to place a severe strain on the available supplies of water in those areas; and

WHEREAS, It is crucial to the economy of Nevada and the welfare of its residents that the water supplies in the state be distributed to all users on an equitable basis; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Assembly of the State of Nevada, the Senate concurring, That the legislative commission conduct a study of the water problems of the state and that the study include:

1. An examination into the present and probable future demands upon the available water supplies;

2. A review of the existing laws regulating the appropriation of surface water and ground water in designated and undesignated basins; and

3. A consideration of possible revisions to the laws to ensure that they provide the most equitable methods of allotting and distributing the water for domestic, commercial, industrial, agricultural and municipal purposes;

### SENATE BILL NO. 263—COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATIVE FUNCTIONS

FEBRUARY 26, 1979

Referred to Committee on Legislative Functions

SUMMARY—Provides for remuneration of legislators and staff during certain adjournments. (BDR 17-876)

EXPLANATION—Matter in italics is new; matter in brackets [ ] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to the state legislature; providing for the remuneration of members and staff during certain adjournments; increasing the per diem expense allowance for members of the legislature; increasing the remuneration of employees of the legislature; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. NRS 218.210 is hereby amended to read as follows: 218.210 1. Each senator [and assemblyman] elected before November 7, 1978, or appointed to succeed a senator [or assemblyman] elected before November 7, 1978, is entitled to receive as compensation \$60 per day for each day of service:

(a) During any regular session, for the number of days the legislature is in session, or in adjournment for not more than 3 days, or the maximum number of days for which compensation for a regular session is permitted by the constitution, whichever is smaller; and

(b) During any special session, for the number of days the legislature is in session or the maximum number of days for which compensation for a special session is permitted by the constitution, whichever is smaller.

2. Each senator and assemblyman elected on or after November 7, 1978, or appointed to succeed a senator or assemblyman elected on or after November 7, 1978, is entitled to receive as compensation \$80 per day for each day of service:

18 (a) During any regular session, for the number of days the legislature is in session, or in adjournment for not more than 3 days, or the maximum number of days for which compensation for a regular session is permitted by the constitution, whichever is smaller; and
