# ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 308—COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

AN ACT relating to roadside parks and safety rest areas; authorizing the regulation thereof; prohibiting commercial activity therein; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. NRS 408.275 is hereby amended to read as follows: 408.275 1. The department shall prepare highway planning surveys, maps and traffic studies for the purposes of securing, preserving and furnishing all necessary information relative to all highways of the state.

2. The department is authorized to construct and maintain roadside parks for the convenience of the traveling public and such roadside parks may be constructed at such locations as may be selected by the engineer.

may be constructed at such locations as may be selected by the engineer.

3. In order to provide information for the traveling public, the engineer may maintain maps, informational directories and advertising pamphlets at safety rest areas. The engineer may, with the concurrence of the board, contract with persons experienced in financing and operating information centers for the dissemination of maps, directories, advertising pamphlets and other information of interest to the traveling public by leasing to such persons available land at safety rest areas for such periods of time and for such considerations as are determined by the engineer to be in the best interests of the State of Nevada.

4. The department is authorized to receive any federal funds available for the purposes of this section as may be authorized under the federal acts described in NRS 408.245.

5. The department shall adopt appropriate regulations governing the use of roadside parks and safety rest areas in the state.

SEC. 2. Chapter 408 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section which shall read as follows:

SECTION 1. NRS 483.470 is hereby amended to read as follows:
483.470 1. The department [is hereby authorized to ] may suspend
the license of a driver without preliminary hearing upon a showing by its
records or other sufficient evidence that the licensee:
(a) Has committed an offense for which mandatory revocation of

license is required upon conviction;

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(b) Has been involved as a driver in any accident resulting in the death or personal injury of another or serious property damage;

(c) Is [an] a habitually reckless or negligent driver of a motor vehicle:

(d) Is [an] a habitual violator of the traffic laws;

(e) Is physically or mentally incompetent to drive a motor vehicle;

(f) Has permitted an unlawful or fraudulent use of [such] his license; (g) Has committed an offense in another state which if committed in this state would be grounds for suspension or revocation; or

(h) Has failed [or refused] to comply with the [terms and] condi-

2. As used in this section, "traffic violation" means conviction on a charge involving of a moving traffic violation in any municipal court, justice's court or district court in the State of Nevada, this state, and includes a finding by a juvenile court pursuant to NRS 62.083 that a

484.455 [No] A person shall not occupy a boat or a house trailer while [it] either is being towed or otherwise moved upon a public highway.
