Chairman Hickey called the meeting to order and opened the hearing on SB 503.

SB 503 CHANGES VARIOUS PROVISIONS RELATING TO DAIRY PRODUCTS AND SUBSTITUTES.

Senator Jacobsen said this bill has to do with the Dairy Commission and has three provisions: (1) substitute dairy products, the Commission no longer wants to inspect non-dairy products; (2) a sunset provision, they would like it removed; and (3) that a dealer not be allowed to sell non-dairy products below cost. He said the Commission is working well; no state money is involved, only their own funds.

In answer to questions, Senator Jacobsen said there were seven employees of the Commission, 3 or 4 of them auditors.

SB 504 CREATES STATE FAIR BOARD

While Senator Jacobsen was present, Chairman Hickey asked him to enlighten the committee on this bill.

The Senator said that 47 acres have been set aside for "agriculture interests." He said the Legislature decided to turn it over to Washoe County, and that's where it currently is. He said each Legislature has put a little more money into the land for Junior Livestock Shows. He said this legislation creates more equal representation on the Board.

SB 503

Motion made by Mr. Marvel to DO PASS, seconded by Mr. Rackley. Motion carried with Mr. Dini voting no. Mr. Rackley will do the floor work.

SB 599 TRANSFERS DUTY OF RECORDING BRANDS OF SHEEP AND GOATS FROM COUNTY RECORDER TO STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

Chairman Hickey said he had received a call from the people who were going to do this work and they indicated they could handle the work and that there has been a reduction in the number of sheep.

Tom Ballow, Executive Director of the State Department of Agriculture, said this is not his department's bill as some people seem to think. He said he supports this bill. it was a good idea for the sheep producers to have one location where they record their brands instead of having to go to seventeen different County Recorders. He said the fiscal impact will be minimal.

In answer'to questions, Mr. Ballow said he was not sure a fee would be charged. He said he did not know if a fee was charged in the counties and felt it probably varied between counties. He said there is a \$25 fee for the initial recording of a brand and a \$20 renewal each four years after that.

Mr. Dini moved DO PASS SB 599, seconded by Mr. Marvel. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION REQUEST (EXHIBIT A)

Chairman Hickey read from a letter from Farmers Home Administration requesting a resolution to create a Farmers Home state office in Nevada. He said we were the only state without a state office.

Moved by Mr. Dini for a RESOLUTION TO BE DRAFTED, seconded by Mr. Kovacs, and carried unanimously.

ADDING ONE MEMBER TO STATE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE. AB 479

Chairman Hickey turned the gavel over to Vice Chairman Rackley.

Mr. Hickey moved to amend AB 479 by deleting the word "agricultural" and inserting "structural" before pest control, seconded by Mr. Kovacs. Motion carried with Mr. Marvel voting no.

Mr. Hickey then moved DO PASS AS AMENDED, seconded by Mr. Kovacs. Motion carried with Mr. Marvel voting no.

Meeting was adjourned at 3:45 p.m.

RESOLUTION

- TO: The Honorable James Santini United States House of Representatives
- WHEREAS, Agricultural revenues in Nevada have increased 270 percent, from \$76 million in 1969 to \$207 million in 1979; and
- WHEREAS, Nevadans recognize the need for a diversified economy which best utilizes existing resources; and
- WHEREAS, the ability to expand the agricultural economy is often reliant on the services provided by Farmers Home Administration (FmHA), a division of the U.S. Department of Agriculture; and
- WHEREAS, FmHA has 45 state offices in the United States and Puerto Rico which serve the needs of farmers and ranchers, and rural communities; and
- WHEREAS, Nevada is the only state outside of the East Coast which does not have its own FmHA office; and
- WHEREAS, Nevada's total FmHA staffing of 14 persons is the lowest in the nation even though Nevada is the seventh largest state in area and is ranked 47th in agricultural revenues; and
- WHEREAS, Nevadans are entitled to a level of FmHA service at least equal to states with less population and fewer agricultural activities;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Nevada State Legislature respectfully requests that Nevada be granted a State Office for Farmers Home Administration and sufficient funding to staff county offices at a level commensurate with staff/population ratios of other Western States.
